



**Texas SAR Arlington Chapter  
Meeting Minutes  
January 10, 2026**

The January 10, 2026, meeting was held at Skillet & Grill, 1801 W Division Street, Arlington, Texas. Members and guests gathered at 09:00 am for fellowship and breakfast.

- I. President Joe Kohn welcomed attendees and opened the meeting for Chapter business at approximately 9:30am.
- II. Chaplain Bob Wehr gave the invocation.
- III. Sergeant-at-arms Richard Martin led the pledges to the U.S. Flag, the Texas Flag, and the Sons of the American Revolution Flag.
- IV. President Kohn recognized Past Chapter Presidents and greeted Chapter Members and our guests.
- V. Compatriot Brent Murray gave a very interesting program consisting of "Battle of Great Cane Brake" in South Carolina, on December 22, 1775. There were approximately 400 battles in South Carolina. The river cane thicket battle in Greenville County was the only battle in the county and only lasted 15 to 30 minutes.
- VI. Compatriot Joe Kohn provided additional information on the battles and activities in South Carolina.

      - Texas SAR Arlington Chapter booklets are available for \$3.00 each, pay the Treasurer.
