Guest Presentation – Dr. Lydia Towns

Dr. Lydia Towns joined us from Nacogdoches. Dr. Towns is a Lecturer in the History Department, faculty advisor for Phi Alpha Theta and Director of the Cartography Lab and History Research Center - a new initiative she started at Stephen F. Austin State University. She also serves as the VP and President Elect of the Society for the History of Discoveries and is the 2nd Vice President of the Texas Map Society and a Faculty Advisor at Phi Alpha Theta.



Her outstanding presentation helped us see that the availability and quality of maps that were available during the Revolutionary War had a huge impact on the battles. Dr. Towns explained how mapmaking evolved over time and how these mapmaking techniques were used by the Americans and the British.

The best available maps of the Colonies were of the larger port cities and that's where the British did well. However, in the inland areas where few good maps existed, the local knowledge of the area helped the Americans excel there.

Dr. Towns pointed out that one of George Washington's first loves and first jobs was as a surveyor. She explained that Washington repeatedly asked Congress for maps and that he had surveyors with his army who would document the areas through which they were traveling for future use.

Dr. Towns brought some maps for viewing after her presentation and answered many questions from the group. Chapter Vice President Keith Pearce presented Dr. Towns with a certification of appreciation from the Sons of the American Revolution.
