He began with the British Long Land Pattern musket that was of smooth bore and 46 inches long, the Sea Pattern Musket which was also smooth bore but the barrel length was shortened to 36 inches. Then he spoke of the Kentucky Long rifle which was actually manufactured in Lancaster PA. The pros and cons of each of these weapons were presented. Mr. Hicks brought in a flintlock musket and explained its' parts and the precision it takes to load it, especially the priming of the flash pan. Mr. Hicks then gave a brief discussion on black powder and how the different grades (1f, 2f, and 3f) were attained.
