Please join us at 6:30 on Tuesday, January 22, at Traditions Restaurant in Tyler for our annual Oration Contest. High school students from 20 Tyler-area High Schools have been invited to participate. Five outstanding high school orators have been selected to compete for the \$525 in scholarships that our Chapter will award.



Each student will recite a patriotic essay, by rote, in front of our audience. The essays will be five-to-six minutes in length. Three anonymous judges will score the speakers on Composition, Delivery, Significance, and History. The winner of our Chapter's contest will compete at the SAR State Oration Competition in Dallas, which will pay \$3,200 in scholarships, and the winner of the State competition will compete at the SAR National Competition in Kansas City, which will pay \$6,500 in scholarships.
