Daniel Shays (1747-1825) was an American soldier, revolutionary, and farmer famous for being one of the leaders of Shays Rebellion, a populist uprising against oppressive debt collection and tax policies in Massachusetts in 1786 and 1787.



Dr. Newsom received his B.A., M.A., and M.S. from the University of Texas at Tyler, and his Ph.D. in History from Texas Christian University. He is currently a Senior Lecturer in History at The University of Texas at Tyler.

Retired General John Furlow and Compatriot Mike Everheart To Serve as Liaisons to American Revolutionary Battles





The Captain William Barron Chapter is pleased to announce that Retired General John Furlow is serving as our Liaison to the Battle of Kettle Creek. The Battle of Kettle Creek (February 14, 1779) was a major encounter in the back country of Georgia during the American Revolutionary War. It was fought in Wilkes County, about eight miles from present-day Washington, Georgia. A militia force of Patriots decisively defeated and scattered a Loyalist militia force that was on its way to British-controlled Augusta, Georgia.

The Captain William Barron Chapter is also pleased to announce that Compatriot Mike Everheart is serving as our Liaison to the Battle of Kings Mountain. The Battle of Kings Mountain was a decisive battle between the Patriot and Loyalist militias in the Southern campaign of the American Revolutionary War. The actual battle took place on October 7, 1780, nine miles south of the present-day town of Kings Mountain, North Carolina, where the Patriot militia defeated the Loyalist militia commanded by British Major Patrick Ferguson of the 71st Foot.
