# 2014 Janice Caldwell Finals of the Joseph S. Rumbaugh Historical Oration Contest

Please join us on Tuesday, January 28, as the Captain William Barron Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution hosts its annual Oration Contest. Five high school students from area high schools will vie for first place and a trip to the state finals in San Antonio during our monthly chapter meeting.



Each student will give an original speech, no shorter than five minutes and no longer than six minutes, on some aspect of the American Revolution. No notes or props may be used during the speech. Judging will be done by SAR members. Over \$500 in scholarships will be awarded.

The Captain William Barron Chapter has a distinguished history of sending excellent speakers from our Chapter to the State Oration Contest and the National Oration Contest. Two national champions, Luis Vasquez (2013, T.K. Gorman H.S.) and Philip Hayes (2009, Lindale H.S.) have come from our chapter. Mr. Vasquez collected over \$6,000 in SAR scholarships last year.

Our meeting will be at Traditions Restaurant, 6205 S. Broadway, Tyler, TX 75703. Arrive as early as 5:45 if you wish to socialize and/or eat dinner. The formal meeting will begin at 6:30 and end before 8:00.

### Captain William Barron Chapter to Honor 2014 Knight Essay Contest Winner



Please join us on Tuesday, March 25, as the Captain William Barron Chapter of the SAR honors this year's winner of the Knight Essay Contest.

The Essay Contest, open to high school students, requires the student to write an original essay of no fewer than 800 words and no more than 1,200 words on a topic related to the American Revolution, Declaration of Independence, the framing of the United States Constitution, or the Magna Carta.

Our chapter will award a \$300 scholarship to the winner, and forward the winning essay to be entered into the TXSSAR Knight Essay Competition, where another \$3,300 in scholarships will be awarded. The winner of the state competition will be entered into the NSSAR competition, where an additional \$3,500 of scholarships will be awarded.

Capt. William Barron Chapter 25, SAR Minutes -- Tuesday, November 26, 2013

The Capt. William Barron Chapter 25, S.A.R., held its regular bimonthly membership meeting on Tuesday, November 26, 2013, at Traditions Restaurant in Tyler, Texas. After everyone had dinner, Chapter President Matthew Lee called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM. There were 20 members, 2 prospective members and 18 other guests present.

Don Major gave the prayer and John Merritt led everyone in the pledges to the flags and the salute to the S.A.R. Matthew gave an update on Anna Lee's medical condition. He then introduced several dignitaries and officers of other heritage groups.

Mike Everheart and John Merritt offered to answer questions on the proposed changes to the Chapter Constitution and Bylaws, which had been published in the "Bugle" and on our website. There was no discussion so Tim West made a motion to pass the revisions as written, the motion was seconded by several members and passed without opposition.

Tim West read the list of nominees for Chapter Officers and said we still need someone to be Vice President of Public Relations and Editor of the "Bugle". He called for additional nominations for any of the positions, but there were none, so the slate will be voted on at the January 2014 meeting.

John then presented the SAR Bronze Good Citizen medal and certificate to Tyler Mayor Barbara Bass, who was given a standing ovation and who gave a short acceptance speech.

John then introduced Danny Sessums, PhD, who gave the evening's program, about the history of the Queen's Loyalists Rangers during the Revolutionary War. Afterwards, John presented Danny with a gift certificate to Barnes & Noble Book Store.

Concerning the Chapter's fundraising gun raffle, Mike announced we had booths at ten gun shows over the past six months and had made approximately a \$2,800 profit for the Chapter's programs. He then conducted the drawings, the winners of which were Barron member Donald Boyd and nonmember Brian Nilson. Mike will make arrangements to get their guns to them.
