Barron Chapter Historical Flag Collection

Continuing our series... Known as the "Don't Tread on Me" flag, this is the First United States Naval Jack, adopted in 1775 by the Colonial Navy. In historical perspective, this is perhaps the most significant flag in our collection...

"Since September 11, 2002, (exactly one year after the Twin Towers attack) the U.S. Navy has flown the First Naval Jack,




a flag bearing 13 red and white stripes, a rattlesnake and the motto 'DONT TREAD ON ME' coming from the first jacks supposedly used by the U.S. Navy

during the Revolutionary War. It is flown from the jack staff from 08:00 AM to sunset while U.S. Navy ships are moored or at anchor. It is also flown from the yardarm during a general court-martial or court of inquiry. During times when the ensign is at half mast, the jack is also at half mast. The jack is hoisted smartly and lowered ceremoniously in the same manner as the ensign, however the jack is not dipped when the ensign is dipped."

Lindale High School Senior Logan Herrera won the Joseph S. Rumbaugh Historical Oration State Contest Saturday, March 29. The competition is hosted by the Sons of the American Revolution (SAR). competed against public, private, and home schooled students. Competitors prepare a five to six minute speech on an event, personality, or document related to the Revolutionary War, while presenting a relationship to present-day America. Students submit their manuscript and deliver their oratory at the contest, without notes or props. Judges select winners based on composition, delivery, significance, and history. "Lindale has been blessed to send several students to the national level in the Sons of the American Revolution Oratory Contest and have had several place at the national level," said Lindale High School Speech and Debate Coach Janice Caldwell. Lindale student Philip Hayes won the national competition in 2009. Now, Herrera will be competing in the summer of 2014 in Greenville, South Carolina for thousands in scholarship dollars and a chance to bring the national title back to Lindale.
