LEAST WE FORGET

Saturday, September 11th, Patriot Day, will mark the 20th anniversary of the terrorist attacks on America. On that day, in three different locations, 2,996 lives were lost – 2,606 at the World Trade Center, 125 at the Pentagon, and the 265 passengers on four airplanes. Of those lost at the Trade Center, 343 were NYC firefighters, 1 was a NYC Fire Patrol Officer, 72 were law enforcement officers from 8 local, state, and federal agencies, and 8 were EMS members from private companies that responded to the event. An additional 55 military personnel lost their lives at the Pentagon. Only 18 survivors were pulled from the rubble of the World Trade Center and 1100 are missing.



There will be an event on the Square on 9/11 starting at 7:30 AM with a nationwide moment of silence at 7:46 AM. If you can't make the event, please take a moment at 7:46 AM. Fly your flags at half-staff in memory of those lost 20 years ago. Watch your local news for detailed information on the event.

We must not forget that on September 17, 1787 the founding fathers signed the most important document in American history, the U.S. Constitution. It has withstood many challenges over the years but still stands the test of time.

VIETNAM VETERAN RECOGNITION PROJECT UPDATE

On August 1st, the Texas African American Museum and the Texas Parks and Wildlife held an exhibit on the Buffalo Soldiers at the Museum in Tyler. African-American veterans in attendance were recognized for their service to the country. As is often the case in Tyler, we found out about this after the event. But in the following days the Chapter was able to make contact with two of the veteran's groups in attendance and presented 10 Vietnam packets to one group and 4 Vietnam packets to the second group. Thanks to Gloria Washington, Executive Director of the Museum, for her assistance in helping us contact those veterans' groups. We will be sending an additional 20 packets to Kay Hable (DAR) in Corsicana, Texas. She and her husband will be attending a West Point reunion and distribute the packets at that event.

A COMPATRIOT'S PATRIOT

Compatriot Bob Plunkett's patriot was Joseph Lemasters. Joseph was born in Maryland on November 15, 1748. He enlisted in Morgan Town, Virginia on December 26, 1776 in Captain David Scott's company of the 13th Virginia Regiment under the command of Colonel William Crawford. He served until discharged on March 1, 1780 by Lt. Colonel Richard Campbell of the 9th Virginia at Fort Pitt. He fought at Brandywine and at Germantown. Joseph then marched to near Pittsburg and fought several fights with Indians. Joseph held the rank of orderly sergeant. Joseph received a warrant from Virginia for 200 acres for his service. In 1818 he offered the land for sale but was only offered \$15 for a hundred acres. In 1819, he applied for a pension and was awarded \$8 per annum. He died in Williamson County, Tennessee on August 10, 1826. Joseph's grandson, Joseph Lemaster McKay would settle in the Republic of Texas and his daughter Susan McKay would be born in the Republic in 1841. These are two of Bob's ancestors that settled in the Republic of Texas. Bob joined the Barron Chapter in December 2017 and is a life member of the Sons of the Republic of Texas.

SEPTEMBER 28th MEETING

There will be a meeting on September 28th at Traditions Restaurant on South Broadway. It will start at 5:30 pm and end at 7:00 pm. Come early to eat and socialize-at a safe distance. Our speaker will Bill Hurst. His topic will be Mary Draper Ingles. Bill is a 25-year member of the SAR and a member of the Edmund Terrell Chapter.

Today the board of NET Health called for masks in schools and businesses due to the high infection rates. Hospitalizations have reached new single-day records seven times since August 24th. To avoid cancelling meetings, we must continue to take precautions to ensure the safety of all attendees. Non-vaccinated attendees must wear masks and maintain social distancing except when eating. For vaccinated attendees, the mask is optional, but encouraged.

MINUTES FOR THE JULY MEETING

The Chapter meeting, held jointly with the Sons of the Republic of Texas (SRT), at Traditions Restaurant was called to order at 5:36 PM by Chapter President Mike Johnson. Reverend Gerry Giles gave the invocation. SRT President, Dr. James Newsom led the pledges to the flags, and SAR VP Terry Cowan delivered the Salute to the SAR.

There being no corrections or objections, the minutes of the May 2021 meeting as published in Captain Barron's Bugle were approved. The SRT minutes were approved by the SRT members.

The scheduled SAR/SRT Eagle Scout presentation was cancelled as the recipient contracted Covid-19 at Scout Camp in Arkansas. Compatriot John Merritt will present the SAR and SRT Scout Certificates to him at a later date.

The SAR Chapter's Veteran Coordinator, King Cole, explained that the SAR Veterans Committee recognizes veterans' service to America and serves those veterans with various programs. He described how veterans can receive an SAR Certificate of Patriotism upon enrollment in a "veterans corp." Rob Jones, a member of SAR and SRT, spoke on the mission and resources of the Smith County Historical Society (SCHS) and introduced former Smith County Sheriff J. B. Smith, the President of the SCHS. Sheriff Smith encouraged all present to utilize the many historical resources of the SCHS. An SAR Certificate of Appreciation to the SCHS was presented to J. B. Smith along with a Vietnam pin. President Johnson presented to Rob Jones an SAR Certificate of Appreciation, an American flag flown over the U.S. Capitol and SRT President James Newsom presented Rob with the current SRT Summerfield G. Roberts award winning book.

President Johnson informed the Chapter that SAR National HQ approved 8 supplemental applications for James Kidd with 4 more to follow. National HQ is processing 2 new membership applications. President Johnson reminded all present that today is Korean War Armistice Day.

SAR VP Terry Cowan led the SAR Recessional followed by Reverend Giles giving the benediction. There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 6:35 PM.
