NATIONAL VIETNAM VETERANS DAY



JANUARY MEETING MINUTES

There being no other business, President Cowan asked Allen Brown to lead the SAR Recessional, followed by Vice-President Giles giving the benediction.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:08 PM.
