A COMPATRIOT'S PATRIOT


Compatriot Dave McLeod joined the Captain William Barron Chapter in 2009. Since then, he has served as the Chapter Treasurer and Chapter President. As a past Chapter President, Dave serves on the Board of Managers. For the past few years, he has served as our Nominations Chair.

Dave's patriot was Simeon Buford. Simeon was born in Culpepper County, Virginia in 1757 and he died in Barren County, Kentucky in 1835. Simeon enlisted in the summer of 1775 and served as a private in his brother, Captain Abraham Buford's, Company. He was in skirmishes at Burrell's Ferry and at Old Jamestown.

He re-enlisted in the fall of 1776 and served three months in Captain William McClanahan's Virginia Company. In the fall of 1777, he served three months as a private in Captain William Chapman's Virginia Company. Early in 1781, he was appointed as an Ensign in Captain Elijah Kirtley's Company and served two months and was then appointed Quartermaster by Colonel James Barbour and served two months until he was appointed Captain to replace Captain Kirtley. Simeon was at the siege at Yorktown.

In March 1833, Simeon was living in Barren County, Kentucky and was granted a pension for his service.

Micah 4 : 1 – 5 KJV

1 But in the last days it shall come to pass, that the mountain of the house of the LORD shall be established in the top of the mountains, and it shall be exalted above the hills; and people shall flow unto it.

2 And many nations shall come, and say, Come, and let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, and to the house of the God of Jacob; and he will teach us of his ways, and we will walk in his paths: for the law shall go forth of Zion, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem.

3 And he shall judge among many people, and rebuke strong nations afar off; and they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruninghooks: nation shall not lift up a sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more.

4 But they shall sit every man under his vine and under his fig tree; and none shall make them afraid: for the mouth of the LORD of hosts hath spoken it.

5 For all people will walk every one in the name of his god, and we will walk in the name of the LORD our God for ever and ever.
