### **July Program**

Our speaker is Dr. Warren H. Hunt. Dr. Warren Hunt graduated from Tulane Medical School. He is a Diplomat of the Board of Internal Medicine and a Fellow of the American College of Physicians. Dr. Hunt has practiced internal medicine in the Longview area for 47 years. He is a member and past officer of the East Texas Chapter of the Sons of American Revolution.

In 2005 Dr. Hunt gave us a program on Francis Marion of South Carolina, who was know as the "Swamp Fox". In 2006 he gave us a program on Brigadier General Dan Morgan, whose brilliant military strategy resulted in the critical defeat of the British at Cowpens, South Carolina.

Our program this month will be on John Paul Jones. John Paul Jones (1747-1792), called the "Father of the American Navy," was known for his courage in fighting against larger and better-equipped enemy fleets. In 1779 he took command of the *Bonhomme Richard (Poor Richard)*, which he named in honor of the American statesman Benjamin Franklin, author of *Poor Richard's Almanac*. I think Dr. Hunt is going to tell us "The Rest of the Story!"

### **Independence Day**

The anniversary of the adoption of the Declaration of Independence by the Continental Congress, July 4, 1776, commemorates the birth of a great nation. It is the greatest secular holiday in the United States, and the proudest; it is a legal holiday in all the states, territories, and possessions, and is celebrated by Americans wherever they may be.



"From the time of the landing of the Pilgrims and the continued influx of the Puritans . . . independence was inevitable; signs of it along the way, 'for coming events cast their shadows before' were Bacon's rebellion in 1676, the Mecklenburg Declaration in 1775, Halifax Resolutions of

Independence adopted in North Carolina in 1776."

"Nothing important merely happens – it develops. The Declaration of Independence was the outcome of a long train of circumstances, all tending to one inevitable end. It was the climax of many decades of thought, discussion, and experience." – Albert Beveridge, U. S. Senator from Indiana, 1899 – 1911

Of the day on which independence was declared, John Adams wrote to his wife a letter that has become historic.

"I am apt to believe that this day will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires, and illuminations, from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward forevermore."
