Fort Hood Hero's

What began as a quiet day at Fort Hood, Texas ended as the deadliest mass shooting on a military base in U.S. history. Maj. Nidal Malik Hasan, a 39 year old Army psychiatrist, allegedly entered a crowded room where soldiers were getting ready for deployment and opened fire. Authorities say Maj. Hasan fired more than 100 rounds, killing 13 and injuring 43 others. A civilian police officer with military service, Sgt. Kimberly Munley fired twice at Maj. Hasan and was shot in each leg and wrist, but continued to return fire. Senior Sgt. Mark Todd, another civilian police officer with military service, joined Sgt. Munley and together they took down Maj. Hasan. Sgt. Munley still remains in a wheel chair while undergoing therapy.

On December 22nd, several from the Captain William Barron Chapter and the Mary Tyler Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution traveled to Fort Hood and watched President General Ed Butler present Heroism Awards to both officers. President General Butler praised both of the hero's pointing out that without their heroic actions the death toll would have been much worse.






Curtis Moore-Pistol Winner
