The Captain William Barron Chapter received several state awards and certificates; Steve Lee and son Matthew received the Camp-d-Aid medal for their hard work in traveling around the country filming the many activities President General Ed Butler has done during his one year tenure. The Capt. Barron Chapter received the TXSSAR Flag Presentation Award, The E.A. Limmer Award in Group #2, (40-99 members) for having the highest percentage of approved supplemental applications in 2009, and won second place recognition in the Poster Contest as well. Our chapter also placed second in Group #2, Outstanding Chapter Awards with 11,150 points accumulated from the 2009 Annual Chapter report. Third place went to the Athens Chapter with 10,392 points. The regular bimonthly meeting of Capt. William Barron Chapter 25 was held on Tuesday, March 23, 2010 at The Woman's Building in Tyler, Texas. President Steve Lee opened the meeting at 6:30pm and called on chapter chaplain, Rev. Don Majors to offer the invocation. Steve reminded everyone of the TXSSAR State Convention March 26th-28th in Houston where the chapter winner in the Janice Caldwell Oration Finals of the Joseph Rumbaugh Essay Contest, Lydia Olsen of Lindale High School would compete. 1st Vice President Tim West was then called forward to present a supplemental certificate and star to Jeff Austin III.
