# President's Message

Congratulations to the Captain William Barron Chapter for their accomplishments in 2010. Our chapter won several awards at the March, 2011, TXSSAR State Convention held in Dallas. Awards presented to the Capt. Barron Chapter were:

Outstanding Chapter Award: (40-99 members/group 2) Awarded to chapters that excelled in all programs, activities, and outreach to non-SAR institutions and groups as reflected in the 12 sections of the Chapter Annual Report.

TXSSAR Americanism Award: (40-99 members/group 2) Awarded to the chapter that develops an exceptional program to recognize patriotic activities of the youth of the state, supports institutions and adults that promote patriotic education, recognizes observance of national holidays, and recognizes outstanding citizenship during the past year.

The Ross Shipman Award: (Division 2/3<sup>rd</sup> place/1 to 4 pages) Awarded to the Capt. William Barron Chapter's "Bugle" newsletter published during the year 2010.

TXSSAR Flag Presentation Awards: Awarded to chapters who have recognized an individual, company, or organization for the proper display, maintenance and care for flying the Flag of the United States during the year 2010. The Captain William Barron Chapter presented three Flag Certificates during the year 2010.

Joseph Rumbaugh Oration Contest: This oration contest is presented without script or props. The student must give a 5 to 6 minute oration on an event, topic, person or ideal associated with the American Revolution. This oration contest is open to students in the sophomore, junior, and senior high school classes in public, parochial, and private schools. Lydia Olson, senior from Lindale High School received a \$500 scholarship check for 4th place.

<u>Patriot Medal</u>: Is the highest medal a state society can award a member. It can be awarded to a person only once. A state society can award one medal for each 500 members in that society. TXSSAR awards five Patriot Medals each year. The Captain William Barron Chapter was honored to have Immediate Past Chapter President <u>Steve Lee</u> as a recipient of the prestigious Patriot Medal for the year 2011. The recipients of this medal must have an outstanding track record not only at the chapter-

level, but on the state level as well. Recipients must also be involved in community activities.

The James Looney Elementary School Poster Contest: This contest was developed to help stimulate interest in American history in support of Texas School 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> grade curriculum. The posters are judged on artistic merit, creativity used to express the annual theme, originality of presentation, and show evidence of research done by the student. The Captain William Barron Chapter won 4<sup>th</sup> place at the state convention. There were 845 schools that submitted over 1400 posters at the TXSSAR chapter level for 2010.

This year is starting off to be just as productive, hopefully better. We have presented three JROTC medals with certificates, and \$100 scholarship checks to cadets from John Tyler, Gilmer, and Marshall High School. We have also presented the EMS Medal and Certificate, Citizenship Medal and Certificate and our Color Guard unit under the leadership of Tom Copeland continues to make appearances around Tyler and Smith County. The Captain William Barron Chapter has three new members so far this year with more on the way. 1st V.P. Tom Copeland continues to attend the area gun shows where he is selling raffle tickets for our black power musket. The revenue that is generated from the sell of the raffle tickets supports the several youth essay contests we sponsor each year, such as the JROTC Contest, Eagle Scout Contest, Elementary School Poster Contests, Janice Caldwell Oration Contests, and the High School History Teacher Essay Contest. All of these youth programs help to spread patriotism in the community. Please support your chapter's youth scholarship programs by purchasing the raffle tickets that Tom Copeland has sent to each of our members. Who knows, you might just win this beautiful black powder weapon! You could also sell tickets to your friends. If you need more tickets, please contact Tom Copeland.
