Officer reports:

- a. The minutes of the October meeting taken by Secretary Robert Kittrell have been approved and posted on our website.
- b. Registrar John Guittard inducted two new members into the Chapter, Bobby Hood and Charles Alspach.
- c. Color Guard Commander FCP Charles Baker spoke of the success of three past events, the Flag Retirement Ceremony, the D.A.R. House at the State Fair and prospective member list, and the Veterans Day parade. D.A.R. member of the Jane Douglas Chapter, Jeanette Prasifka, founder of the Old Worn Flag Movement, was presented a Certificate of Appreciation.

- a. Chaplin Frank Pounders, who is on the nominating committee, gave a list of officers for 2012 including Bob Northcraft as President, Nick Harper as First Vice President, Robert Kittrell as Second Vice President, and John Guittard as Secretary. Offices now available are those of Registrar and Treasurer.
- b. The Bylaws of the Chapter are to be published twice in the next two issues of the newsletter.
- c. Chapter President David Temple asked for a volunteer to handle the visit to the Veterans

 Hospital with donated magazines from the members. Compatriot Harry Friedrich volunteered.

FVP Bob Northcraft presented the main speaker, Compatriot Mike Radcliff, dressed as a colonial gave a superb speech of George Mason who argued for individual and states' rights to be included in the U.S. Constitution. He feared the encroachment of a central government without the guarantee of rights in the Constitution. Afterwards Mike Radcliff was given a Certificate of Appreciation and a Liberty Bell by FVP Bob Northcraft.
