Pearl Harbor during WWII.








Minutes of the previous meeting were approved as posted on the Chapter's website.

Former NSSAR President General and TXSSAR President Nathan White stepped up to the podium to present a very informative and entertaining program.


His topic was on Patriot Peter Francisco- a giant of a man at 6'6" tall and 260 lbs. and known as *Hercules of the Revolution*. He was called a <u>one-man army</u> by George Washington because of his feats of strength & courage during various battles.

A DVD video presentation created by one of Peter's descendants was then shown and we learned a number of facts about Francisco not often recorded in literary books.

At the age of fourteen he was in attendance, peering through the windows of St John's Church during the 2nd Virginia Convention where he heard such notables as Thomas Jefferson and Patrick Henry ("...give me liberty or give me death") speak. It was then he decided to join the cause for freedom. He didn't get to join the Tenth Virginia Regiment until he was almost sixteen, but by then he was impressive looking at full height and weight.



He fought at Brandywine, wintered at Valley Forge and captured the British Flag at the battle of Stony Point, New York. Making sure that the British did not salvage one of their disabled cannons during the Battle at Camden, SC - he hoisted the 1100 lb. unit onto his shoulder and returned it to Colonial lines.

The positions of Second Vice President, Secretary, Chaplain and Historian were not filled and the slate not published. David called for nominations from the floor. Mark Hansen nominated Mike Petritis/Second Vice President (motion received a second). Frank Pounders nominated Charles Standard/Secretary (however, he declined). Their administrative term will commence after the vote and installation in January.

The President alerted the membership that Mark Howell has to relinquish his duties as Newsletter Editor.

James Fairbairn reported that our recent donations (\$200 financial and clothing) were greatly appreciated by the Homeless Veterans, but that the Veterans Affairs group ran out funds and items before they could provide for all the needy. He asked that we consider bringing additional donations (mostly coats, caps and socks) to the next meeting.

Charles Baker announced that he gave out five "Flag Certificates" and needs three more. Bob Northcraft has found a history teacher for entry in this year's TXSSAR competition.

Tom Whitelock noted that East Fork Trinity Chapter had borrowed our "boat-float" for the Rockwall Christmas Parade and showed their appreciation by improving on some of its fixtures for us.

Door prize drawings were conducted by the Treasurer and Bob asked the current Officers to join him in the conference room after the meeting for a special business meeting.
