## <u>Americanism</u>

FCP and Head Greeter, Ralph McDowell presented an informative presentation on the "Coins in Ben Franklin's Pocket and More". Mr. McDowell offered the group some insight into the coinage that was around during the time of Benjamin Franklin. Mr. Franklin was a runaway, and was urged to go to Philadelphia to find a place to work and live.

The common coins of the day were the Dutch Dollar and a shilling in copper. There was not much gold or silver in the market. Many of the coins also came from Spain. The Pillar Dollar was a very common coin and was used up until 1810.

When George Washington became President, he appointed Thomas Jefferson as the Secretary of the Treasury. Jefferson set up the mint system and used a decimal standard. The first mint was opened in Philadelphia in 1792 and a mint continues in operation there today.



## Program

Today's featured speaker was **Former President General, Judge Edward F. Butler**. Judge Butler made a presentation on "The Contributions of Spain to the American Revolution". Judge Butler has written a book on this subject entitled "Galvez and Spain: Our Forgotten Ally in the War of the American Revolution". Judge Butler informed the group that Bernardo De Galvez aided the American Colonists in obtaining help from Spain. Spain sent many troops to the Louisiana area and to Pensacola and Mobile. Spain and France worked together to weaken the British which assisted the colonists in their efforts to win the Revolution.

1st Vice President, Mark Hansen showed appreciation from the Chapter by presenting Judge Butler with a Certificate of Appreciation and a replica of a war cannon.

He also stated that the ladies accompanying their spouses could attend a tour of the Bush Library.
