

Texas Society President < Mike Radcliff, was introduced to the attendees and presented a special gift for taking time out of his busy schedule to visit with us and explain his program for the coming term year. President Radcliff emphasized that all

Chapters need to look at more effective membership growth by having Compatriots that sponsor new prospects, should become more involved with their application, the proper process and qualifications – not rely on (or over burden) the Registrar. Likewise, take a genuine interest in their attendance and the reason for their wanting to join SAR.

He further pointed out that the limited participation time by active members may cause a reduction in youth programs, thus each Officer and/or Committee Chairman needs to establish a mentor or assistant process in order to cover responsibilities and present a good community image. He feels that there is no value in "burning out the troops" for just <u>points sake.</u>

One of the President's goals is to make sure "dues billing" is moved up to September so that it doesn't become a last minute (December) notice and cause a drawn out project for renewals and a potential reduction of membership. He noted how FCP Ralph McDowell has "fought the good battle" for so many years to get delinquent members to make payments. Mike said that he's forming a new committee to look into automatic <u>credit card renewals</u> so that members can always have their dues paid on time. This method may very well help in retaining new members. In addition, he hopes that more Chapters institute the new "familiarization" program wherein older members have a special training session get-together with new members to explain SAR's various programs and hopefully excite them into participating.

Members were reminded that on June 18th J a US Flag Retirement Ceremony will be held at the *Veterans Memorial* in Frisco Commons and that all are invited to participate at 10:00am.
