

He has noticed many people don't, but we need to serve as examples.




## GUEST SPEAKER Richard McCaslin >

The Senior Professor at UNT's History Department presented unique highlights from one of his seventeen books with emphasis on

"Mystic Cords of Memory – Robert E. Lee and the American Revolution" to which he discussed how George Washington and early Lee Family had

crossed paths many times. Lee's father Light Horse Harry Lee said to his son, "...don't follow my example, but rather that of the *Great George Washington*.

Bet you didn't know that Mount Vernon land once belonged to the Lee family or that it was Lee that stole away Washington's first sweetheart. And yet, a number of Lees joined forces

with Washingtons in both business and politics.

It is rumored Henry "Dragoon Harry" Lee II was the one who stole Washington's first girlfriend.
