## **DECEMBER 10, 2016 Minutes of the Dallas Chapter** Sons of the American Revolution

President **George Ramphrey** called monthly meeting to order at 8:30am in the dining room of the Presbyterian Village North retirement community in Dallas, Texas. He asked FCP **Robert Kittrell** to lead the membership in the pledge to the United States Flag which was followed by Chaplain **Frank Pounders** rendering the morning's Invocation. Pledge the Texas Flag was led by **Warren Johnson**. President Ramphrey led the Affirmation to the **SAR**. Compatriot FCP **Tracy Pounders** next led the attendees in "*My Country Tis of Thee*."

Head Greeter FCP **Ralph McDowell** acknowledged his assistant for this morning was **Glenn Toal**,> who had just recently returned with a great suntan from a visit to Hawaii. They greeted 24 Compatriots and 6 guests.



FCP **Charles Baker**, the chapter's teller of humorous tales, unveiled biblical history of how Pharaoh's army was destroyed (under 10" of water) by Moses at the Red Sea.

Compatriot < **Ralph McDowell** again presented both an interesting and educational program for all to enjoy. He spoke on *America's First Patent*. He pointed out that the *Constitution* contains a provision (Article I – Section 8) "**To promote the Progress of Science and useful Arts, by securing for limited Times to Authors and Inventors the Exclusive Right to their respective Writings and Discoveries;"** 

Ralph then passed out sample copies of the very first patent issued in 1790 – It was for a chemical called <u>potash</u>

and the official document No. X000001 was signed by non-other than *George Washington* himself.

The first person credited a patent was Samuel Hopkins, who burnt hard wood and the resultant substance was used to create potash. It was not until 1802 that the official patent office was established

Ralph also handed out copies of Philadelphia, PA 's 1790 census noting that individuals had their occupation listed alongside their name – similar to Jefferson above.



<**Robert Tanner, Jr. &** his Dad informed Ralph that their family (way back when) was linked to the first "washing machine" patent. *Ralph rewarded the Sr. Tanner later on this morning by singing Happy Birthday to him as well as giving him a gift of four quarters to use at a* <u>nearby laundromat</u>.





Vice President of Programs, Warren Johnson next introduced the honorable < Ken Tapscott Judge of the County Court of Law #4.

Prior to his presentation on the topic "*Right To Trial By Jury*" he handed out booklets containing **The Constitution of the United States and Declaration of Independence.** The Judge proceeded to outline the format of his speech as being a simple tracing English Common Law and jury trials, how it came to America as well as how we made it broader. He also passed out copies of a 2007 poll titled "God and the Constitution."

He started off by explaining that his particular court operates with <u>six person juries</u> instead of the common known twelve members. It was Thomas Jefferson that pointed out that it was the King who limited jury trials thus riling the colonists. In fact they wanted more jury trials in

all civil cases related to personal and property rights. Judge Tapscott's very informative speech not only was educational and occasionally humorous, but generated a large number of questions from the attendees.
