Religious Freedom

"A declaration of rights made by the representatives of the good people of Virginia, assembled in full and free convention which rights do pertain to them and their posterity, as the basis and foundation of government."-Adopted June 12, 1776. This Declaration later became a model for the Bill of Rights James Madison wrote as the first twelve proposed amendments to the new United States Constitution. Article 16 of Virginia's Bill of Rights reads:

"That religion, or the duty which we owe to our Creator and the manner of discharging it, can be directed by reason and conviction, not by force or violence; and therefore, all men are equally entitled to the free exercise of religion, according to the dictates of conscience; and that it is the mutual duty of all to practice Christian forbearance, love, and charity towards each other."

The behavior of the people of Afghanistan recently rescued from the tyrannical rule of the Taliban is a clear reminder of the intent of our Founding Fathers in drafting such language concerning religion. We call it "freedom of religion". It has been demonstrated that the source most often cited by the Founding Fathers was the Bible. Their frame of reference is obvious in our most precious documents. I'm no theologian, but legislative and judicial decisions made in the last few decades don't seem quite as "Godcentric". When did freedom of religion change to "freedom from religion"? In the absence of a few moral absolutes, all that's left is situational ethics. What better time than the Holiday Season to reflect upon the religious roots of your forefathers and do your part to preserve those values?






