- "Were the pictures which have been drawn by the political jealousy of some among us faithful likenesses of the human character, the inference would be that there is not sufficient virtue among men for self-government..."-James Madison, The Federalist, #60, 1788
- "The existence of such a government as ours for any length of time is a full proof of a general dissemination of knowledge and virtue throughout the whole body of the people."-John Adams' Inaugural Address, March 4, 1797
- "Whether this [liberty] will prove a blessing or a curse will depend upon the use our people make of the blessings which a gracious God hath bestowed upon us. If they be wise, they will be great and happy. If they are of a contrary character, they will be miserable. Righteousness alone shall exalt them as a nation. Reader! Whoever thou art, remember this, and in thy sphere practice virtue thyself, and encourage it in others."-The concluding lines of a note found with Patrick Henry's will after his death in 1799



Who'd a thought it? Compatriot Art Ingalls holds the door prize that he won when he drew his own ticket at the January meeting!


