## **Celebrate Independence!**

In July 4<sup>th</sup>, 1826, the fiftieth anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, both Thomas Jefferson and John Adams died within a few hours of each other. While Thomas Jefferson was the author of the declaration itself. John Adams was, in the words of Mr. Jefferson, the pillar of its support on the floor of Congress; its ablest advocate and defender against the multifarious assaults, which were made against it."

In a letter to his wife Abigail, Adams said, "the greatest question was decided that was ever debated in America; and greater, perhaps, never was or will be decided among men. A resolution was passed, without one dissenting colony, 'That these United States are, and of right ought to be free and independent states.' The 4th of July, 1776, will be a memorable epoch in the history of America. I am apt to believe it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance...from this time forward, forever. ... I can see that the end is worth more than all the means; and that posterity will triumph."

Fifty years later, Thomas Jefferson was asked to attend the anniversary program in Washington. He declined due to poor health, but he sent a letter to the committee expressing his view of the significance of the occasion: "May it be to the world, what I believe it will be, (to some parts sooner, to others later, but finally to all,) the signal of arousing men to burst the chains under which monkish ignorance and superstition had persuaded them to bind themselves, and to assume the blessings and security of selfgovernment. That form which we have substituted, restores the free right to the unbounded exercise of reason and freedom of opinion. All eyes are opened, or opening, to the rights of man."

- **3-J Col. William Prescott** (1775, at Battle of Bunker Hill): "Don't fire until you see the whites of their eyes."
- **4-A George Washington** (1786): "Mankind, when left to themselves, are unfit for their own government."
