Honoring Luke

I want to tell you about Luke Boatright, the nephew of a friend of mine. Luke was a good kid who grew up in Collin and Grayson Counties. His parents raised him well, instilling in him the courage and strength it takes to be a man. He graduated from Frisco High School and joined the Army in 1999. He married a beautiful girl and had three daughters. And he was recently promoted to Sergeant, assigned to serve in Iraq with the 1st Cavalry Division, scheduled to return home in early February.

On Saturday, December 4th, Luke was killed by a roadside bomb in Baghdad. He was 24. His funeral, with full military honors, was on Monday, December 13th in Frisco; he was later interred at the Sam Houston National Cemetery in San Antonio.

Luke was a patriot. He loved his country. He served it willingly. And he gave his life to keep us safe. We should honor his life for that.

We must also honor the other persons that have given patriotic service with Luke. His parents, who dedicated their lives to seeing that he became a man, but will not know the man that he could have been. His uncle Curt, who loved him as a son. His three daughters, who will grow up knowing their father was a brave and courageous patriot, but won't see him on the sidelines at their soccer games, or walk with him down the aisle. And his wife, who has lost her companion in life.

These loved ones have also given a life in the defense of this nation. Please join me in honoring Luke and his loved ones by living lives that are deserving of their sacrifices.
