





It was from Philadelphia County that he joined the Continental Army and served as a private in Captain William Neilson's Company.

Another line of Mike's ancestry reaches to Peterfield Jefferson, a politician in the Virginia Colony who was a first cousin of Thomas Jefferson V, author of our Declaration of Independence and third President of the United States.

The Joseph S. Rumbaugh Historical Oration Contest is open to all students attending public, parochial, or private high schools who are in their sophomore, junior or senior year of study during the contest year. The contest is designed to explore the influence of the Revolutionary War on present day America. Rumbaugh was the first Chairman on the NSSAR Oration Committee.
