


Find Family News and Events Using NewspaperArchive

Newspaper research is fun! Where else can you find so many interesting tidbits, gossip, obituaries, wedding notices, sports mentions, and so much more about your ancestors?

In this second installment in our series on genealogical databases available from home for FREE with your Denton Public Library card, we're looking at a great newspaper resource: NewspaperArchive.

To get started, access the NewspaperArchive database at this link: https://library.cityofdenton.com/screens/sc_resources.html. You'll need to enter your library card number and your pin to log in to the site.

From the NewspaperArchive homepage, you can either dive right into searching for your ancestors or scroll down to take a look at the various publications available on the site by location, date, or publication name. Remember that no one newspaper site will hold images for every newspaper, nor every year for any given newspaper. It pays to determine if the site includes newspapers of interest



before you get frustrated looking for items in papers not in their collection or not for the dates you need.

The browse by location option shows that NewspaperArchive holds not only U.S.-based newspapers, but also from a wide range of countries, from Canada to Mexico, Algeria to Uzbekistan. Target the locality you wish to search for by choosing the country, state, city, and publication options.

The browse by date page allows searchers to find newspapers by century from the 1600s to the 2000s. Choosing any century brings up a list of the years in which the site has newspapers in its collection. Clicking on the year brings up all the newspapers available for that year. (Be sure scroll down the page to view this option.)

The browse by publication page takes you to the "All Newspaper Directory," which is listed by date the title was most recently updated. Clicking on the red "Newspaper" heading will re-sort the titles alphabetically. Narrow your location, date range, and title by entering information in the search boxes on the right side.

Using this search option, I located a few paragraphs about my grandfather Thomas Kozlina, who was the victim of a hit and run in 1934 near Lemont Furnace, Fayette County, Pennsylvania, in which he suffered a broken jaw. The item was part of a larger article about a string of auto accidents in the area, including a fatal bus accident. The two paragraphs include my grandfather's age, local address, who he was travelling with, where they were headed, and that his condition at the hospital was good.1

Once logged in, researchers can create a free account in order to save favorite pages or specific searches and create folders for clippings. Click on the "My Account" option at the top right to work with those features.

NewspaperArchive has one feature I've never seen in a newspaper database before: options to change the shape of the clipping for those odd articles which span more than one column. What a great option!

If scrolling through old newspapers is a favorite pastime, be sure to check out NewspaperArchive with your DPL card. Here's hoping you find some family treasures!
