Family Lore

The bane of my existence as the self-proclaimed family genealogist is family lore.

For example, my 7th great grandpa Thomas Nickell (c1747-1807) was supposedly older, in the French and Indian War with his father John, served in Lord Dunmore's War, and gave supplies during the RevWar.

The only thing accurate above is he gave supplies to the Patriot cause. He provided 13 diets.

I see the same information passed on as fact by family members throughout the decades. None of it holds up to any scrutiny. Some have made Thomas older to make him able to serve in the F&I War with his father John. There is no evidence either served in the war. Nor was father John married twice to make it possible for Thomas to be older. The next persistent myth is Thomas and his brother Joseph served in Lord Dunmore's War and were at Point Pleasant. There was a Thomas and Joseph Nichols that served as guides out of Ft Pitt. They were well known scouts and interpreters out of PA. They, obviously, were not my Thomas and Joseph from what is now Monroe Co, WV. Their brother Issac was at Point Pleasant with the VA militia and is on the monument. Things must have gotten garbled along the way.

The facts are: Thomas was Scotch Irish descent, born in the Valley of VA, lived in what is now Monroe Co, WV, gave supplies to the Patriot cause, and passed away in 1807.

It was hard wading through the meadow muffins but I fell better knowing the truth.

I guess my point is: Let the facts guide you rather than family gossip and embellishment.

Thomas and Joseph Nickell not in Dunmore's War

Decades of family lore notwithstanding,

Thomas and Joseph Nichols/Nickell did not serve in Dunmore's War in 1774.

The Thomas and Joseph Nichols(on) on the roster from Ft Pitt lived in PA.

The Thomas from PA also served in the disastrous Crawford expedition to Sandusky and was living in Washington Co, PA in 1782.

Our Thomas and Joseph lived in what is now Monroe Co, WV.

Two different sets of brothers.



Slowly emerging were four uniformed SAR Color Guard members caring the flags and flanked by militia musket bearers on each end of the line.

I know every spectator watching the Color Guard marching in that Fourth of July parade felt a strong sense of patriotism and were proud to be an American.

That, is what SAR Color Guard units do. It is the "pay" we receive for volunteering our time and energies to promoting patriotism.

That is what the Denton SAR Chapter Color Guard "COULD" do. Yes it takes time, priority and a little cash. But to be in that parade and pass by a little boy, flag in hand, and saluting our flag will remain in my mind forever.

Denton Library Info

Explore the Denton Record-Chronicle from Home

Our series on genealogical databases available to you for FREE and accessible from home with your Denton Public Library card continues with a look at the Denton Record-Chronicle Collection available through NewsBank. Grab your DPL library card and navigate to the Denton Public Library website and the Denton Newspapers page. Next, click on the Denton Record-Chronicle Archive, where you will enter your DPL card number to gain access to the database.




You'll see that there are three items in the collection under "Source Name":

The major difference between the three options is that some of the issues are available as images, while the others are text transcriptions only. The date ranges are different as well, with the text-only versions spanning 2004-present, and the image-only versions from 2018-present. The third entry, "Denton Record-Chronicle Blogs (TX)" are text versions of various sports-related blogs published by the newspaper. Check there for local high school and college sports info.

You can begin to search the newspaper for articles of interest by entering info on the main page or clicking any of the choices in the collection. Here's a demonstration of searching in the first two collections.

Text-Only Collection

I entered "Denton County Genealogical Society" in the search box for the first text-only collection and produced 233 results ranging as far back as 2004. Each results page shows a preview of the result:



You can preview the article by clicking the eyeball icon, then click on either the highlighted headline (in this case "A") or the preview box itself to go to the text version of the page. Scrolling down, the search term will be highlighted.

The menu bar across the article page lets you change the text size, cite the article, email, print, download, save, or link the article, or even share to Google Classroom!

Image-only Collection

I repeated my search term "Denton County Genealogical Society" in the image-only collection next and got 33 results from 2018-2024.

In the list of results, clicking on the eyeball preview icon shows a larger pop-up section of the page; clicking the blue headline takes me to an image of the entire page, where thumbnails of the entire issue are on the right. Click on any page image to change pages.

Here are a few more tips on using the **Denton Record-Chronicle Collection**:

If you plan to search the collection often, create a personal folder or save clippings to a session folder once you've logged in.

You can also save a search or create an alert for your search terms, all from the results page for your search term.

Refine your search results using the left menu: Sort by best match, newest or oldest clipping. Select dates with the slider bar or enter specific dates you wish to search, choose the specific year from the Year option, select a specific source, or even pick an article based on how easy it is to read with the "Lexile (readability)" option which divides the search results into ranges from a 3rd grade through high school level of reading complexity.

The Denton Record-Chronicle Collection is just one more in the amazing free resources available to DPL cardholders. Get a local slant on a national issue or look for your Denton-area ancestors in this terrific database.
