He gave a very interesting talk about the history of the Sherman Fire Department from its establishment in 1873 to present. It was first known as Sam Houston Steam Fire Company. Their moto is "When Duty Calls 'tis Ours to obey". Longtime residents of Sherman should remember two or three locations for the Central Fire Station. And, Yes; they still have the 1951 Mack Firetruck and use it for parade and other special occasions.

Thomas Brown was presented a Fire and Safety Certificate and Commendation Medal plus a flag Certificate for the Fire Department.



If you attended the February 16, 2017 meeting of the Martha Jefferson Randolph Chapter of the DAR you will know that they honored seven (7) Vietnam Veterans with the Congressional Vietnam Veterans pin. They were Ken Durbin, Russell Green, Roy Hernandez, Phil Hunter, Robert Kroeger, Mickey Mickelson, and Ivill Thompson.

At their March 23, 2017, meeting their speaker was Ivert Mayhugh, owner of "A Touch of Class Antique Mall" in Sherman. He is interested in preserving Sherman's historic legacy and is deeply involved with efforts to revitalize the old downtown district. His talk focused on Capt. Randolph Marcy's 1852 survey expeditions in Texas and finding the source(s) of the Red River. He also talked about why Capt. Marcy was ordered by the U.S. Government to do this. It is believed that he may have been the first to record in writing, the basic vocabulary of the Comanche and Witchita languages. The book you see Mr. Mayhugh holding was written for congress. The rock is on the square in Sherman.

METAL OF HONOR PARADE IN GAINESVILLE


April 8, 2017, was a great day for a parade. The Texas Sons of the America Revolution Color Guard were number 31 out of approx. 80 entries; each and everyone was paying respect to these great heroes and numerous other veterans and organizations. There were twenty (20) Color Guardsmen from the Northern Region and one from the Southern Region, Jim Clements of the Patrick Henry Chapter. It had been decided that the Texas SAR Color Guard would march the parade route and break away at the end in order to salute the Medal Of Honor individuals who had come to Gainesville. Prior to the beginning of the parade we were to assemble at the intersection of Broadway and Denton when word was received that the Medal of Honor personal would be ahead of us in the parade. However; luck was on our side as they were lined up on Denton Street and would be passing us as they turned onto Broadway. Adjustments were made and we lined up single file down Denton Street on their left and were able to salute them as they passed. Once passed, we quickly reassembled on Broadway to get into our proper place in the parade. This year the new Northern Commander, Ted Wilson was joined by Marshall Cope (our youngest SAR member) to lead the Texas SAR Color Guard. PATRIOT BALL:
