On July 24, 2019, the body of Army Cpl. Billy Joe Butler were returned from North Korea. He has been captured during the Korean War and died in a prisoner of war camp. It was flown into San Antonio Airport and transported to the Kerrville Funeral Home where the final resting place would be the Nicholas Cemetery on July 26, 2019.

Blair Rudy, the Southern SAR Commander, assembled the color guard. As was reported to me the turnout was stunning. There were state, county, city law enforcement along with military and citizens. The meeting opened with the invocation by Don Babbs, Chaplin followed by the pledges to the American flag, the Texas flag, and to the Sons of the American Revolution. Ted introduced the Texas Society Officers present and gave them time to make opening comments.

We began with President David temple installing Thomas Richards as a new member of the Denton Chapter. Topics of discussion were the upcoming **BOM** (October 4-6) in Arlington; **Youth** contests; **Registrar**'s problems; Color Guard events on the state calendar; **Veterans** activities and **H**istorical storage.

One of the biggest problems in the state society and District 11 is retention of current membership. We need to find ways to keep members active.
