

# In Memory of William Byron "BILL" Watts



William Byron Watts, Jr. June 14, 1949 - June 05, 2025 In Loving Memory of William Byron "Bill" Watts, Jr. June 14, 1949 – June 5, 2025 With deeply heavy hearts, we announce the passing of William Byron Watts, Jr., affectionately known to family, friends, and fellow patriots as "Bill." He departed this world peacefully on June 5, 2025, just nine days shy of his 76th birthday, leaving behind a legacy of integrity, service, scholarship, and love. Bill's life was a testament to leadership, tireless dedication, and a



genuine heart that deeply impacted everyone privileged to know him. Bill was born on June 14, 1949, in Columbia, South Carolina, to William and Letha Watts, and was the eldest of five children. His early years were full of adventure, mischief, and learning, especially during cherished summers spent on his grandparents' farm in Pageland, South Carolina. Those childhood days - filled with laughter, livestock, and the closeness of family - were some of his fondest memories. Bill and his siblings shared a special bond that remained strong throughout his life. Alongside brothers Chuck and Donny, sister Cindy, and younger brother Marty, Bill's upbringing was rich in both love and characterbuilding experiences as the family moved across South Carolina, North Carolina, and Georgia. A lifelong learner, Bill pursued education with determination and depth. He studied across several institutions, including Georgetown College, The University of Texas at El Paso, Amberton University, and Texas Woman's University, ultimately earning his Bachelor of Arts and two Master of Business Administration degrees. Bill's early professional career was rooted in the roofing and construction industry, where he excelled as a Sales Management Trainer, Territory Manager, and General Manager, traveling extensively across North and South America. Known for his deep industry knowledge and ability to mentor others, he built a reputation as a trusted leader and problem-solver. Yet Bill's heart was always drawn to making a meaningful impact- and that calling led him to a second career in education. He returned to college to earn his Elementary Teaching Certificate and spent over 15 years in the classroom, igniting curiosity and confidence in countless students. His retirement from teaching in 2014 marked the end of one chapter of service and the beginning of another. In retirement, Bill devoted himself to a cause that resonated deeply with his sense of history and patriotism: the National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution (SAR). His involvement with the SAR was more than a hobby - it became a deeply meaningful mission, allowing him to honor his ten proven Patriot Ancestors, educate the public, and foster civic pride. Bill's list of SAR accomplishments is as remarkable as itis extensive. He: - Served on five National Committees - Held leadership roles including Texas State Color Guard Commander, Patriot Grave Marking Co-Chair, Council of Chapter Presidents Chairman, Chapter President, Vice President, and Secretary – Worked diligently as a Compatriot and Patriot History Data Entry Specialist – Attended six National Congresses, five District Conferences, six State Annual Meetings, and numerous Board of Managers meetings – Was an active member of six SAR chapters across Texas and South Carolina



Bill received over 26 medals recognizing his commitment and leadership, including all three levels of National and State Color Guard Medals. He was named Texas State Color Guardsman of the Year, became a George Washington Fellow, and in 2025, received the prestigious Patriot Medal, the highest honor awarded by the State Society. His dedication didn't stop at administrative excellence - Bill was also a passionate historical educator. As a member of the State Speakers Bureau, he captivated audiences across Texas with his engaging portrayals of Benjamin Franklin, bringing Revolutionary War history to life for students, community groups, and civic organizations. He believed that understanding our past gave us a clearer path towards a better future. Bill was preceded in death by his beloved parents, his brother Chuck, and the love of his life, Laura. Their love was rare -steadfast, supportive, and enduring. Her loss was deeply felt, and Bill often spoke of her with reverence and affection. It was his wish to be laid to rest beside her, which will be fulfilled on July 26th, 2025. He is survived by his siblings: brother Donny Watts, sister Cindy Watts, and brother Marty Watts. He also leaves behind a wide circle of extended family members, fellow educators, dear friends, and SAR members across the country who were touched by his friendship, mentorship, and service. A memorial service honoring Bill's life will be held at 2:00 PM on Saturday, July 26, 2025, at Reflections Chapel at Rest Haven Funeral Home, located at 2500 State Highway 66 East, Rockwall, TX 75087. Following the chapel service, Bill's inurnment will take place in the Memories Urn Garden at Rest Haven Memorial Park, where he will be laid to rest alongside his beloved Laura. In accordance with Bill's wishes, in lieu of flowers, memorial donations may be made to one of two charitable funds established to continue the work Bill held closest to his heart: The Tom and Montye Whitelock Color Guard Fund Inc or The Bill and Laura Watts Youth Awards Fund Inc. Bill Watts was a man who lived with purpose, spoke with intention, and gave of himself freely. Whether in the boardroom, the classroom, or in colonial costume at a school assembly, he led with humility, humor, and heart. His life was one of service - to



country, to students, to history, and to those he loved most. His legacy will continue to inspire generations to come. Bill will be forever missed by all those who had the privilege of knowing him. Arrangements have been entrusted to Rest Haven Funeral Home – Rockwall, TX.
