Program

- Program – This month our program is: "The Over the Mountain Men" by James Battles, PhD. is a distinguished leader whose career spans nearly four decades of service as a Captain in the United States Navy, specializing in surface warfare, strategic planning, and systems design. His command of four major naval reserve units across Ohio and Texas reflects his deep operational expertise and commitment to national defense. His valor and dedication earned him the Vietnam Veteran Service Medal and the prestigious Presidential Unit Citation Award. Parallel to his military service, James built an influential academic career as Professor of Biomedical Communication at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas. In this role, he directed faculty development programs, evaluated educational initiatives, and mentored araduate students in the Master of Arts in Biomedical Communications program. His contributions extended across the university, enhancing instructional quality and academic innovation. Prior to this, James served as Director and CEO of the Ohio Regional Medical Consortium, where he oversaw strategic operations, financial management, and grant development. He holds a Ph.D. in Curriculum and Foundations and an M.A. in Educational Communications from The Ohio State University, and has authored numerous articles and books. His scholarly excellence was recognized with a Literary Award from the Health Sciences Communication Association and a "Best Article" honor from The Journal of Biocommunication. Internationally regarded as a thought leader in patient safety, James has pioneered proactive risk assessment methodologies and risk-informed design of safety interventions. He leads key



initiatives at the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ), advancing patient safety culture and interprofessional teamwork in collaboration with the Department of Defense. James's career is a testament to intellectual rigor, strategic vision, and unwavering service—spanning the battlefield, the classroom, and the global healthcare arena. James became a member of the SAR in 2015 and has documented a total of 12 proven Patriots in his lineage.

Tom Milson, VP Programs, introduced the Guest Speaker. The program was a 61 minute presentation, followed by a short question and answer session. Tom Milson thanked him and presented him with a Certificate of Appreciation.
