Program

- Program – This month our program is: "For our program we are honored to have William S. (Bill) Covington, Jr. joining us again to present: "Revolutionary War Patriot John Abston"

Bill Covington is a retired public school teacher and historian and a member of the Arlington Chapter SAR.

John Abston is the only Revolutionary War Patriot buried in Collin County. Bill discussed the pension application process for Revolutionary War veterans, focusing on John Abston's case. He explained that Abston, born in 1761, served under Captain John Ellis and later Captain Rose, but his pension applications were rejected twice, possibly due to the difficulty in verifying his service.



Despite being the first patriot mentioned in a book about Southern campaigns, Abston's applications were rejected even with supporting affidavits from pastors and other reputable individuals. Bill suggested that Abstin may not have known about the pension application process until later in life, leading to his delayed application.

Tom Milson, VP Programs, introduced the Guest Speaker. The program was a 31 minute presentation, followed by a short question and answer session. Tom Milson thanked him and presented him with a Certificate of Appreciation.



Awards



- Mark McCraw presented the Law Enforcement award to 12-year department veteran Detective Jonathan Glidden, from the McKinney Police Department's Crimes Against Children unit, was recognized for his work in investigating and testifying on difficult cases, including child exploitation and human trafficking.



- Tom Milson presented Richard Bonaparte the chapter registrar, the Liberty Medal with Oak Leaf Cluster from the National Society SAR, for his outstanding service in recruiting new members, having processed 20 applications in a single year, and presented him with a certificate.





- Richard Bonaparte presented compatriot Kevin Ennis with three supplemental stars for confirming additional patriot ancestors. Kevin read a short biography for his patriot ancestors.
- Tom Milson introduced Lyn Thomas, the Chapter Regent for the John Abston Chapter McKinney Chapter DAR. Lyn introduced Stephanie Hunt the First Vice Regent along with her mother Joy Bradford, who presented awards to several individuals, for their efforts in supporting the America 250 American Revolution exhibit at the Collin County Historical Museum. The DAR chapter expressed appreciation for the members' dedication and hard work in making the exhibit a success, with over 774 visitors.
- Further, Lyn Thomas recognized Tom Milson and awarded him with the: **The Hannah White Arnett Medal** is one of DAR's newest recognitions. It may be awarded to a member in good standing of the Sons of the American Revolution (SAR) or Sons of the Revolution (S.R.) for unselfish



devotion, tireless efforts, and assistance to the DAR; and who has dedicated his time, energy, talents, and/or resources to the organization in support and furtherance of the DAR mission of historic preservation, education and patriotism. Lyn cited Tom's extensive contributions to the DAR and the McKinney DAR John Abston Chapter, and herself, for all his hard work.
