The Badge of Military Merit

The Purple Heart which has been presented To every wounded veteran since 1932, has Its beginning in the Revolutionary War. Created by General George Washington at his headquarters in Newburg, New York on August 7, 1782, it was presented to only three Soldiers. All three were from Connecticut.

Bryon Lee Basham passed away on December 30, 1999. He is survived by his wife Bobbie Basham and their five children, Cheryl and her husband T. J. Loftin, Byron Craig and his wife Susan Basham, Spud and his wife Marian Basham, Kevin Basham, Jody and his wife Lynn Basham. He is also survived by his mother Daisy Cline Ewing, a sister June Reid and brothers Lester Basham and Danny Basham. Bryon also had 17 Grandchildren and five great grandchildren.

Bryon's patriot was Obediah Basham. He was a Private in the Continental Army from 1777 to 1779. He was born 7 April 1760 in Virginia and died 28 May 1840 in Breckenridge, Kentucky. He married Celia Dowell on 5 September 1782 in Bedford, Virginia.
