## **PINEYWOODS COMPATRIOT'S PATRIOT BIOGRAPHY**

JOHN OLIVER ALBRIGHT #119889 -  
TX#7911  
(PATRIOT) CAPTAIN WILLIAM WINNE -  
5TH GREAT GRANDFATHER

WILLIAM WINNE, THE SON OF DANIEL  
WINNE AND DIRCKIE VAN ESCH, WAS  
BAPTIZED ON 22 APR 1716 IN THE  
REFORM DUTCH CHURCH OF ALBANY,  
NEW YORK. BY 1748 WILLIAM HAD  
MARRIED MARIA DeWANDELER OF  
ALBANY, AND BY 1767 THEY OWNED A  
MIDDLE CLASS HOME IN ALBANY'S  
DUTCH WARD VALUED AT \$18. AT THAT  
TIME WILLIAM WAS ACTIVE IN THE  
LOCAL MILITIA AS A SERGEANT IN  
CAPTAIN JOACHAM STAATS' COMPANY.

WITH THE COMING OF THE  
REVOLUTION AND IN PARTICULAR THE  
CAPTURE OF FORT TICONDEROGA, ON  
18 MAY 1775, WILLIAM WINNE DONATED  
8 SHILLINGS TO A FUND RAISED IN  
ALBANY TO PURCHASE PROVISIONS  
FOR THE PATRIOT TROOPS HOLDING  
THE FORT. BY NOVEMBER OF 1777  
WILLIAM HAD RAISED A COMPANY OF  
MILITIA AT WHICH TIME HE WAS PAID  
\$20.17.6 FOR "PAY AND SUBSISTENCE"  
OF HIS COMPANY. ALSO IN 1777  
WILLIAM IS REPORTED TO HAVE MADE  
"TWO TRIPS WITH HIS SLOOP TO  
MANOR OF LIVINGSTON FOR THE SALT  
ALLOTTED TO (ALBANY) COUNTY".

I AM DESCENDED FROM WILLIAM BY  
HIS DAUGHTER ELIZABETH WHO WAS  
BAPTIZED IN ALBANY ON 12 APRIL 1752,  
AND WHO MARRIED ANOTHER  
REVOLUTIONARY WAR PATRIOT, JOHN  
KNICKERBOCKER III. WILLIAM WINNE  
LIVED TO THE RIPE OLD AGE OF 91 AND  
PASSED AWAY ON 18 NOVEMBER 1807  
AND IS BURIED IN THE  
KNICKERBOCKER FAMILY CEMETERY  
IN SCHAGTOCOKE, NY


