



LASER PRINTER NEEDED



COMPATRIOTS PATRIOT

Dennis M. Key #128747 TX5671

Patriot Philip Key 1750 - 1820

Philip Key was born 1750 in St. Mary's County. Maryland. He was the son of Dr. John Key, who died after being poisoned by two family slaves. He was the grandson of Philip Key (1) and Susan Barton Gardnier. Philip Key (1), the grandfather, arrived in the Colony of Maryland in 1720 and established the Key family in Southern Maryland which is now part of St. Mary's County. Philip Key(1) was the great-grandfather of Francis Scott Key, who was the author of the "Star Spangled Banner".

In 1767 Philip Key went to London to be educated in Middle Temple Law and he was presented at the Court of St. James at the age of 19. In 1770 he returned to Maryland to become a lawyer, tobacco planter, merchant, and schooner owner in partnership with General Uriah Forrest. He owned 2900 acres of land in St. Mary's and Charles counties. He also helped finance the American Revolution. Philip Key purchased "Tudor Hall", a plantation in Leonardtown, Maryland and gave it to his son, Henry Greenfield Southoron Key, as a wedding gift. Philip Key lived at "Gravelly Hills Farm" in Chaptico, Maryland until his death in 1820.

He was a Member of the Lower House, in St. Mary's County Orphan's Court. He was Speaker of the House of the Maryland Assemblies, served on the Committee of Correspondence for St. Mary's County in 1774, and was a Representative in the United States Congress from 1791 to 1793. Philip Key was offered the Office of Governor of Maryland and also a place in President James Monroe's Cabinet but declined both offers.

Philip Key was married twice. His first marriage was to Rebecca Jowles
Sothoron where 10 children were born.
During Philip Key's second marriage, he and his wife, Sophia Hall, had 8 children. The fourth child was Thomas White Key.

Thomas White Key was born in St. Mary's County in 1802 or 1803. He came to Texas in 1835 where he settled in Liberty County as a merchant and a farmer. He was a tax collector for the Republic of Texas. He was also a city councilman for the City of Liberty, and a Justice of the Peace for Chambers County. Thomas White Key was married to Nancy Evelyn Murphy and had six children. Our grandfather, great-grandfather, and great, greatgrandfather, Southern Confereracy Key (born 18 October 1861), was their fourth child.


