HARDIN-John Henry "Papa" Key, 84, died September 14, 1999 in Liberty. He was a lifetime resident of the Hardin area. He was a member of the Hardin United Methodist Church, and was active in several clubs and organizations such as the Sons of Confederate Veterans, Sons of the Republic of Texas, Liberty County Farm Bureau, Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Assoc., Independent Cattlemen's Assoc., and Coastal Cattleman's Assoc. He enjoyed playing baseball in his younger years where he was a good left-handed pitcher. He loved spending time in the outdoors and ranching. He retired from Humble Pipeline after 37 years of service.

Services were held September 16 at Hardin United Methodist Church in Hardin with the Rev. Gideon Watson officiating. Burial followed at Hardin Chapel Cemetery in Hardin. He is preceded in death by his first wife, Iris Elaine Key; one sister, Mary Lou Sapp; one brother Francis Alvin Key.

He is survived by his loving wife, Jewell Key of Hardin; three sons, Ronnie Key and wife Kitty of Hull, John H. Key Jr. and wife LaNelle of Fannett, and Mike Key of Humble; step-daughter Jeanie George and husband Michael of Anahuac; ten grandchildren and twenty great grandchildren.
