The Patriot Medal is the highest award a state society can pin on a member. Ray not only has been busy playing his fife at color guard functions for more than three years; he developed Cox Software, which is an electronic SAR Application process. He did the lion's share of the work in writing the TXSSAR History Book Volume I and II. He rewrote and re-organized the TXSSAR Chapter Presidents and chaired the committee providing training for new, and old, Chapter Presidents. While doing this, he accepted the position of District 8 Vice President.

Ray's SAR Application was approved June 1, 1995, and since that time he has served the Piney Woods Chapter in many positions including President. Currently, he is our Sergeant at Arms and maintains our Chapter website.

Ray is the Fourth Piney Woods Compatriot to receive this honor. Allan Henshaw in 1995, Thomas M. Green in 1997, and Tom Lawrence received this award in 2007.

Ron Barker will be assuming that position until we can get a volunteer. Our other officers were incumbents, Allan Henshaw, Chancellor, Kim Morton, Genealogist, Bob McKenna, Registrar, Ken Cheatum, Historian, Ray Cox Sgt. at Arms and Webmaster.

The March 20, 2008 meeting was a very active one. Five members of the Color Guard were presented Bronze Color Guard Medals and Certificates by President Elect Harry Fife for more than three years of active service in the Texas Society and National Society Color Guard; Ray Cox, Jim Jones, Jim Mitchell, Richard Shanks, and Larry Stevens. President Barker had already received the award when a member in California but was given a certificate to certify him as a Texas Color Guard member. Also the color guard members were presented the Friedrich Von Steuben NSSAR Medal which is worn on the color guard uniform. Ron was also presented his Past President's Pin by Larry Stevens and Allan Henshaw. Harry Fife presented him with his Past President Certificate.

Walter Thompson who joined PineyWoods last year was presented the SAR War Service Medal for his service in the United States Navy in WWII and the Korean Conflict. Our Historian Ken Cheatum, a retired fireman and who served in the U. S. Air Force and the U. S. Coast Guard, was presented the SAR Fire Safety Medal and Certificate for his service to the community during Katrina and Rita.

Larry Stevens will serve as Chairman of the State Meetings Committee, Vice Chair of the Council of Chapter Presidents, and a member of the Long Term Planning Committee. Ron Barker will be the Chair of the JROTC Awards Committee.

Eagle Scout Joseph Fochtman, sponsored by PineyWoods, was selected as the TXSSAR Eagle Scout Scholarship winner. His parents Jerry and Donna Fochtman and his brother Jason, who was the 2005 PineyWoods and TXSSAR Eagle Scout Scholarship recipient, were able to attend the presentation.

The National Congress will be in Sacramento, California, July 4 through July 10, 2008. All NSSAR members of good standing can attend. Registration information is posted on the National web site and the TXSSAR web site. Barbara and I will be attending the congress as well as several other PineyWoods members.

The next State Meeting will be in Tyler, Texas, August 1- 3, 2008, at the Holiday Inn Select, 903-561-5800, 5701 So. Broadway, Tyler, hosted by the Capt. William Barron Chapter. This meeting, as are all state meetings, is open to all SAR members of good standing.

Our Color Guard marched in the Laredo George Washington Day Parade with an estimated 500,000 lining the streets. PineyWoods joined President Rick Ramirez of the Patrick Henry Chapter and his members. We were entry 86A of nearly two hundred groups marching in the parade. I talked with a group of men who were awarded the Purple Heart who were walking in the parade. These men served WWII, Korea or Vietnam.

We presented the Colors at the Paul Carrington Chapter George Washington Awards Dinner, the FBI Retirees Luncheon, and we marched in the Kingwood George Washington Day Parade. 

Guest Speaker for May 15, 2008 Meeting

Tracing Your Genetic Lineage : Having Fun with DNA and Genealogy



This presentation will demonstrate how modern genetics is contributing to a better understanding of human genealogy. It will also highlight a project in which people can use their DNA to trace back the lineage of their family to ancestral roots. Dr. Shmaefsky will explain in simple terms how genetic genealogy is done and how the Genographic Project can be used to trace families.

Dr. Brian Shmaefsky is currently a professor of biology at Lone Star College - Kingwood, north of Houston, TX and coordinates the college's service learning program. His research emphasis is in environmental physiology. Dr. Shmaefsky previously worked as an industrial biochemist at Sigma Chemical Company and was a professor at Northwestern Oklahoma State University and Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville. He has done many presentations on scientific public education in addition to his professional work. He also serves on international organizations and governing boards on science policy and science education. Dr. Shmaefsky is also very active volunteering on environmental awareness and policy committees in Texas. Plus, Dr. Shmaefsky has many publications on scientific discoveries and on science education in professional journals and trade magazines. His writing includes several books on biotechnology and human diseases.

In Memoriam Bill Foster

December 24, 1925 – March 14, 2008

Bill Foster, 82, born December 24, 1925, to Samuel and Mildred Foster in Beaumont, TX, died March 14, 2008, in Kingwood, TX.

Mr. Foster was a 1943 graduate of Waco High School, after graduation he served in the Navy as a Chief Petty Officer during World War II. After the war, he attended Southern Methodist University and graduated in 1949. During his life he worked as a tax specialist with British American Oil, Gulf Oil and Chevron Oil until his retirement in 1986. He was active in the Humble Area Genealogical Society, a member in the Sons of the American Revolution and a member of Kingwood Christian Church, Disciple of Christ.

Mr. Foster is survived by his loving wife of 57 years Dixie Ann Foster; children, Lurie McAdow and husband Lewis, William Foster III and wife Jana; beloved grandchildren, William Foster IV, Katherine Lynne Foster, and Lewis McAdow IV. Memorial Services will be 10:30 A.M., Monday, March 24, 2008 at Kingwood Christian Church, 3910 West Lake Houston Pkwy., Kingwood, TX 77339.

Patriot Thomas C. Holmes

Memorial Marker Ceremony

The PineyWoods Chapter #51, along with members of the TXSSAR Color Guard, will be assisting the Daniel Witcher DAR Chapter and the Alexander Love DAR Chapter in the placement of memorial markers commemorating the service of Patriot Thomas C. Holmes.



The DAR bronze memorial marker and the SAR marker will be placed in the Holmes family plot in the Trout Creek Cemetery in Trout, TX. The actual location of the grave of Thomas C. Holmes is in the "Blackshear Fields" in the southeastern part of the Farrsville community off of Highway 63, approximately 40-45 miles north of the Trout Creek cemetery. The Farrsville location is inaccessible without serious off-road capability and therefore is not conducive to any type of public ceremony.

The service of Patriot Thomas C. Holmes is described in FPG (NSSAR) Clovis Brakebill's book "*American Revolutionary Soldiers Buried in Texas*" as follows:

"Thomas C. Holmes was born in Wayne County, North Carolina in 1759 and married Elizabeth Jourdon in 1794. He served as an express rider for Capt. Benjamin Harrison's 1st South Carolina Regiment, under General Francis Marion, The Swamp Fox, and carried a message from General Marion to General George Washington. He applied for his pension in 1854 while living in Newton County, Texas where he had been living since 1835, and he died there in 1861. There is a brass US Government marker on his grave, but no SAR or DAR marker."

Note: Although the Brakebill book and the brass marker at the actual grave site (see picture above) list the date of death as 1861, this cannot be verified from any source. Thomas C. Holmes' will was probated in 1856, further disputing the date.

Details of the ceremony are as follows:

Date: Saturday, 26 April 2008

Time: 1:00pm

Place: Trout Creek Cemetery, Call (Trout), Texas




