FROM THE EDITOR

The British Army's infantry were nicknamed "redcoats" for their military uniforms, and sometimes "devils" by some colonists. They had occupied Boston since 1768 and had been augmented by naval forces and marines to enforce what the colonists called The Intolerable Acts of 1774, which had been passed by the British Parliament to pun-

ish the entire Province of Massachusetts Bay for the Boston Tea Party and other acts of protest.

On the evening of April 18, 1775, a plan was formed to hang lanterns in the Steeple of Old North Church to signal the impending arrival of Redcoat soldiers – one if by land and two if by sea, and These two lanterns were the force behind the now famous Midnight Ride of Paul Revere to warn that the British were coming.

On the morning of April 19, 1775, after waiting all night, Parker got the information he was waiting for when Thaddeus Bowman, the last scout that Parker had sent out, rode up at a gallop and told him that they were not only coming but coming in force and they were close. Captain Parker was clearly aware that he was outmatched in the confrontation and was not prepared to sacrifice his men for no purpose. He knew that most of the colonists' powder and military supplies at Concord had already been hidden. No war had been declared. (The Declaration of Independence was more than fourteen months in the future.) He also knew the British had gone on such expeditions before in Massachusetts, found nothing, and marched back to Boston.

The rest of the story is history. Ashot rang out and the British Army fired killing British citizens. The War was beginning. 250 Years ago TODAY! Larry Stevens

The PineyWoods Youth Activities program has always been dedicated to fostering the growth and development of young individuals within the community. Through various initiatives, the program aims to provide enriching experiences that promote leadership, teamwork, and academic excellence.

ESSAY and ORATION Contest—PineyWoods was fortune enough to sponsor Allison Fruewirth as an Essay Contestant. She was award the chapter first place award. Freedom Chapter who meets in Shenandoah sponsored Allison in the SAR Oration Contest. And she was selected to complete for the Texas SAR Contest. She delivered her talk on Galvez in a convincing dramatic portrayal and easily was judge the best. All five contestant speeches were videoed. Allison's video will be submitted for the NSSAR Contest in July, and if selected she will trave to Connecticut for a try at First Place.

Junior ROTC - 21 Bronze Medals have been taken or mailed to High Schools in our area for presentation at Annual Awards Ceremonies. Only Cleveland on April 22, Porter on April 17, and Splendora on May 17th, provided information on their awards events and asked for a representative from the chapter to be present for the Bronze Medal presentation. Freedom Chapter has agreed to take care of the five Klien Schools this year as they did last year. Freedom has asked for a meeting later this year to discuss the assignment of schools due to the change in chapter demographics over the past 10 years. Several schools originally adopted by PineyWoods in 2017 and 2018 are no longer tenable due to travel distance, Pasadena, Deer Park, La Porte, and Baytown. These should go to the Galvez or Paul Carrington Chapters. Lamar High School West of downtown Houston should be handled by Paul Carrington.
