TO ALL PLANO SAR CHAPTER MEMBERS WHO SERVED DURING THE VIETNAM WAR ERA:

The Department of Defense (DoD) has authorized any veterans who served anywhere and in any capacity during the Vietnam Era, Nov 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975 to be eligible to receive a **Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin (VVLP)**.

Pins have previously been awarded at scheduled group events, but the DoD has now made it possible for eligible veterans to request a pin be delivered to their home address. This program is open to all Veterans, not just our chapter members, so if you know of eligible veterans not in our chapter, feel free to notify them of the program. If eligible Veterans have not previously received a pin, here is how one can be ordered:

1. Veterans who served anywhere in any capacity during the period Nov 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975 are eligible to receive a pin.
2. Veterans can email whs.pentagon.wso.mbx.vnwar50th-cpp-events-application@mail.mil and a Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin will be sent to you via USPS. Please include a good mailing address including your city and state.

The Wall That Heals Traveling Vietnam Veterans Memorial Exhibit Frisco TX 2 May - 5 May 2024

The Wall That Heals is a three-quarter scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial along with a mobile Education Center. The traveling exhibit honors the more than 3 million Americans who served in the U.S. Armed forces in the Vietnam War and it bears the names of the 58,281 men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice in Vietnam.

The Frisco VFW Post 8273 and we of the Plano Chapter of the DAR are excited to announce that we will be sponsoring The Wall That Heals (Vietnam Traveling Wall). It's coming to Frisco Wednesday 2 May, 2024 - Sunday 5 May, 2024. The event will kick off on 30 April with an escort through Frisco as the wall travels to Grand Park, located at the NW corner of Dallas North Tollway and Cotton Gin. All are encouraged to line the route and observe the wall as it travels to Grand Park. On 1 May, the Wall will be assembled, with the Exhibit officially opening on 2 May. The exhibit is 375 feet in length and 7.5 feet tall. A mobile Education Center is also part of the exhibit. Frisco is the only Texas stop in 2024.

Many Vietnam veterans may never be able to visit the Vietnam Memorial in Washington DC, so this opportunity is particularly meaningful. Like the original Memorial, the Wall That Heals is erected in a chevron-shape and visitors can do name rubbings of individual service member's names on the wall.

George Hallmark**

George Hallmark was born in England in 1742, the illegitimate son of Mary Hallmark. In 1766 he was convicted of stealing a linen handkerchief. His sentence was transportation to the Colony of Virginia. In 1773 he was listed as being delinquent of his taxes in Fincastle County in the Western part of Virginia. However, in 1781 he was a drover delivering beef and other goods to the military. This was a critical service considering the adage "An Army travels on its stomach".

He continued to move west though North Carolina, Tennessee, and finally Alabama where he had a large family. His son made it all the way to Houston Texas.

The United States Marine Corps Hymn

The "Marines' Hymn", the official hymn of the United States Marine Corps, was introduced by the first director of the USMC Band, Francesco Maria Scala. Its music originates from an 1867 work by Jacques Offenbach with the lyrics added by an anonymous author at an unknown time in the following years. Authorized by the Commandant of the Marine Corps in 1929, it is the oldest official song in the United States Armed Forces.[1] The "Marines' Hymn" is typically sung at the position of attention as a gesture of respect, akin to a national anthem. However, the third verse is also used as a toast during formal events, such as the birthday ball and other ceremonies.


Call to Order: The Meeting is called to order by President Bob Johns at 7:01pm.

The History Minute



“The Intolerable Acts” Presented by Randy Bush, Secretary



Compatriot Bush discusses the five individual acts, known collectively as the Coercive Acts and the Intolerable Acts, placed into law by the Crown in retaliation for the Boston Tea Party:

- The Boston Port Act - 25 March 1774. The blockade of Boston Harbor by the Royal Navy
- Massachusetts Government Act - 20 May 1774. The Massachusetts Bay Colony Charter is revoked, converting the Colony into a Royal Colony.
- The Act for the Impartial Administration of Justice - 20 May 1774. Eliminates the right to a trial by ones peers by allowing the Governor to move any trail to Great Britain.
- Quartering Act - 2 June 1774. Requires colonists to house troops in “uninhabited houses, barns, or other buildings” at their own expense.
- The Quebec Act - 22 June 1774. This act extends the borders of Quebec southward to the Ohio River.

- 26 Chapters have filed Veterans Activity Reports.
- Members have provided volunteer services totalling 788 hours.
- \$19,656.00 worth of items have been donated to VA nursing and hospital centers.
- 1007 publications have been donated.
- 1045 individual volunteer hours have been performed.
- 26,259 miles have been driven by volunteers in support of Veterans activities.
- 78877 wreaths have been purchased for the Wreaths Across America program.
- 804 members participated in Veterans funerals.
- 1,700 miles were driven by members participating in the funerals.
