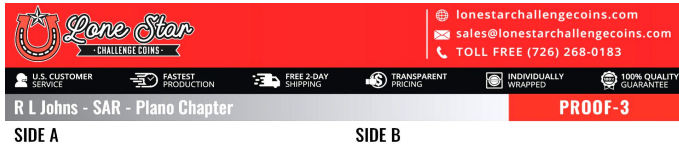

TO ALL PLANO SAR CHAPTER MEMBERS WHO SERVED DURING THE VIETNAM WAR ERA:

The Department of Defense (DoD) has authorized any veterans who served anywhere and in any capacity during the Vietnam Era, Nov 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975 to be eligible to receive a **Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin (VVLP)**.

Pins have previously been awarded at scheduled group events, but the DoD has now made it possible for eligible veterans to request a pin be delivered to their home address. This program is open to all Veterans, not just our chapter members, so if you know of eligible veterans not in our chapter, feel free to notify them of the program. If eligible Veterans have not previously received a pin, here is how one can be ordered:

1. Veterans who served anywhere in any capacity during the period Nov 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975 are eligible to receive a pin.
2. Veterans can email whs.pentagon.wso.mbx.vnwar50th-cpp-events-application@mail.mil and a Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin will be sent to you via USPS. Please include a good mailing address including your city and state.

Patriot Stories

**Contributed by BJ Bjorklund
Regarding his Patriot Ancestor
John Edwards**

John Edwards was born on 19 September 1760. He enlisted in the Massachusetts Militia on 7 July 1777 serving in Colonel John Robinson's Regiment, Captain Alishai Brown's Company. He served for 5 months and 28 days and rose to the rank of Colonel. He passed away in 1803 in Acton, Massachusetts.

Compatriot Bjorklund has the singular privilege of having in his possession a story recounted first hand from Patriot Edwards' wife, Susanna Harrington Edwards, to her granddaughter, a portion of which is recounted here. Please feel free to inquire of Compatriot Bjorklund as to the full story, as it is fascinating!

"On the early morning of April 19th, 1775 our grandmother, Susannah Harrington, a young girl of a dozen years or more, was awakened by the alarm "The Redcoats are coming!". This was the name given to the British soldiers by our people, on account of the color of their uniforms. The body of eight hundred British regulars sent from Boston under command of Major Pitcairn had reached Lexington on their way to Concord., with the purpose not only to capture the ammunition secreted there by the patriots, but also to get possession of the persons of John Hancock and Samuel Adams, those two "Arch Rebels", so called by the Tories.

My grandmother would graphically tell how the women of the village, taking their little children with them, gathered on a small eminence overlooking the village green, and there, as the murderous fire of the British soldiers swept down their loved ones, fell on their knees and groaned and shrieked and prayed.

Among those who fell, fatally wounded, she recognized her favorite cousin, Jonathan Harrington, whose home was only a few rods away, across the road from the battleground. As she watched, she saw him struggle to his feet and then fall again, trying painfully to crawl to his doorstep, where stood his young wife with her babe in her arms. Not once thinking of the danger to herself from the enemy's bullets, the young girl fled like a deer down the steep little hill and came to the door just as her cousin reached it to fall dying in the arms of his wife. Together, they dragged their dead hero into the hall and laid him on the couch."

He is predeceased by two sons - Greg Sanders and Ryan Sanders. He is survived by Kay, his wife of 57 years; sons Jeff and Mike and his wife Jennifer; and his sister Carolyn Boon.

This Month's Fun Factoid



The Great New York City Fire of 1776



The Great Fire of New York was a devastating fire that burned through the night of September 20, 1776, and into the morning of September 21, on the West Side of what then constituted New York City at the southern end of the island of Manhattan. It broke out in the early days of the military occupation of the city by British forces during the American Revolutionary War. The fire destroyed from 10 to 25 percent of the buildings in the city.

General George Washington had the unenviable task of evacuating before the advancing British. He asked Congress to allow him to burn the city as he retreated in order to deprive the British of a strategic base of operations, but Congress steadfastly refused. While neither the Patriots nor the British claimed responsibility for setting the fire, General Washington wrote to his cousin, Lund, "Providence - or some good, honest fellow has done more for us than we were disposed to do for ourselves."

As no proof for the origin of the fire has been established, the debate still rages: Was the fire deliberately set by Washington's retreating troops? Was it set by Patriots acting independently? Was it set by the British or was it completely accidental? We may never know.....

The History Minute “The East India Company” Presented by Randall Bush, Secretary



Randall explains that the East India Company was an English, and later British, joint-stock company founded in 1600 and dissolved in 1874. It was formed to trade in the Indian Ocean region, initially with the East Indies (South Asia and Southeast Asia), and later with East Asia. The company gained control of large parts of the Indian subcontinent and Hong Kong. At its peak, the company was the largest corporation in the world by various measures and had its own armed forces in the form of the company's three presidency armies, totaling about 260,000 soldiers, twice the size of the British Army at certain times.

The Featured Speaker Presentation

“The 1936 Texas Centennial, The Construction of the Hall of State and a History of the Dallas Historical Society”

Introduced by Melvin Richards, VP of Programs

Presented by David Lee, Dallas Historical Society - Director of Education

David presents the history of George Bannerman Dealey, a publisher and civic planner who was instrumental in operating early Dallas newspapers and was instrumental in the creation of Fair Park and acquiring a branch of the Federal Reserve Bank. He long advocated for the creation of a Historical Society in Dallas, which was founded in 1922. He then discussed the creation of the 1936 Texas Centennial celebration and how it was decided to hold the event in Dallas and the construction of the Texas Hall of State in 1935. He then spoke about upcoming events taking place at the Historical Society and ways in which we may help, conduct research and join the Society.
