

### The 2025 Activities Celebrating President James Monroe's 267th Birthday

You are cordially invited to attend and participate in both ceremonies for President Monroe – one in Richmond (at Hollywood Cemetery) and the other in Westmoreland County (at the Monroe Birthplace farm south of Colonial Beach). As always, these events are free and open to the public, so we hope that you will encourage your family and friends to join you.

#### Hollywood Cemetery Ceremony 412 S Cherry St Richmond VA 23220 28 April 2025, 11:00am

This year our annual wreath-laying ceremony at *President Monroe's tomb* in *Hollywood Cemetery* in Richmond will be at *11:00 a.m. Monday morning*. April 28 is President Monroe's actual birthday, and the Hollywood Cemetery ceremony is traditionally held on that date. Since the 1930s, the Hollywood Cemetery ceremony has included a formal military ceremony with an Army unit presenting a wreath on behalf of the President. That tradition was discontinued by the Army last year. and we do not yet know when or if it will resume. Last year's ceremony, with a Foundation supplied color guard and band, was still outstanding, and the wreath presentations by a large number of lineage societies were as impressive as ever.

After the ceremony, a *lunch reception* will be held at the *Taylor House, 2325 Monument Avenue* in Richmond. The Taylor House is regarded as one of the finest homes in Richmond, and the reception there last year was a great success.

Starting at **2:00 p.m. at the Birthplace**, the 267th anniversary ceremonies are expected to include local and state elected officials. Come to see both the **Birthplace House** and the exhibits at the **Visitor Center**. The ceremony will be in front of the Birthplace House again, rather than in front of the Visitor Center. See <u>www.monroefoundation.org</u> for the Birthplace location at 4460 James Monroe Highway (State Rt. 205) just outside of Colonial Beach.

Please remember that President Monroe was the only President besides George Washington to have actively served in the regular army during the Revolutionary War, participating in six major battles (as well as wintering at Valley Forge, crossing the Delaware with George Washington, being seriously wounded at Trenton and cited for conspicuous bravery) and subsequently served simultaneously as Secretary of War and Secretary of State (during the War of 1812, when he helped coordinate American defenses against the British). He was also an active participant in our first American lineage society, the Society of the Cincinnati.

When James Monroe and other patriots seized the Virginia Governor's Palace on June 24, 1775, and distributed its armory of muskets, pistols, and swords to the Williamsburg militia, that act began the Revolutionary War in Virginia. Let's celebrate that 250th anniversary by honoring James Monroe in proper fashion!

We hope that you will be able to participate with us in these commemorations to emphasize the role of this great Virginian and Founding Father in establishing our country, and its system of government and values.

### TO ALL PLANO SAR CHAPTER MEMBERS

### WHO SERVED DURING THE VIETNAM WAR ERA:

The Department of Defense (DoD) has authorized any veterans who served anywhere and in any capacity during the Vietnam Era, Nov 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975 to be eligible to receive a **Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin (VVLP)**.

Pins have previously been awarded at scheduled group events, but the DoD has now made it possible for eligible veterans to request a pin be delivered to their home address. This program is open to all Veterans, not just our chapter members, so if you know of eligible veterans not in our chapter, feel free to notify them of the program. If eligible Veterans have not previously received a pin, here is how one can be ordered:

1. Veterans who served anywhere in any capacity during the period Nov 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975 are eligible to receive a pin.

2. Veterans can email <u>whs.pentagon.wso.mbx.vnwar50th-cpp-events-application@mail.mil</u> and a Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin will be sent to you via USPS. Please include a good mailing address including your city and state.

## **Patriot Stories**

Isaac Washburn was born on Feb. 1, 1755 in Middleborough, Mass. He resided in Taunton, Mass.

Isaac was a descendant of Mayflower pilgrim Priscilla Mullins and John Alden. Unfortunately, the Pilgrims were ill equipped for the harsh Massachusetts winter and a large percentage of them died during the first year. Eighteen year old Priscilla was the only member of her family to survive the first winter. Her father, step-mother and younger brother all perished. She and John were the third Mayflower couple to marry sometime between 1621 and 1623.

Isaac was a Taunton Minuteman under Capt. Robert Crossman in Col. Nathaniel Leonard's regiment. On April 20, 1775, word of the battles at Lexington and Concord reached Taunton which is about 40 miles south of Boston. The Taunton militia assembled and marched to Dorchester Heights under the command of Capt. Oliver Sofer and became part of the 8th Foot Company of Col. Timothy Walker's Massachusetts Regiment. Isaac later served in the 22nd and 13th Regiments. Isaac served 3 enlistments (which were traditionally short terms), is credited 1 year and 18 days of service in the War of Revolution; and, is a veteran of the Battle of Boston.

Isaac married three times and had 17 children. His first wife, Polly, died at age 25 on June 7, 1785. His second wife, Eunice, died May 12, 1997 at age 37. His third wife, Elizabeth "Betsey" Richmond, died July 11, 1855 at age 75. He had four children with Polly, four with Eunice and nine with Betsey, including John Nichols Washburn who is the grandfather of my paternal grandmother. Isaac died in Taunton on Nov. 3, 1832 at age 77. He and his three wives are buried in the Plain Cemetery in Taunton, Massachusetts.

### The History of Boston Baked Beans

Cornbread and baked beans were commonly made by Native Americans and the Pilgrims at Plymouth Colony learned these recipes in the early 1620s. They likely added barley to the cornmeal to invent New England brown bread. The triangular trade of slaves in the 18th century helped to make Boston an exporter of rum, which is produced by the distillation of fermented molasses. At that time, molasses was added to local baked bean recipes, creating a distinctive style of baked beans unique to New England.

In colonial New England, baked beans were traditionally cooked on Saturdays and left in brick ovens overnight. On Sundays, the beans were still hot, allowing people to indulge in a hot meal and still comply with Sabbath restrictions. Brown bread and baked beans along with frankfurters continue to be a popular Saturday night staple throughout the region.

The region has two main styles of baked beans: Boston baked beans and Maine baked beans. The difference between the two styles is that Boston beans are made with small white navy beans or pea beans with thin skin while Maine beans are made with native bean varieties with thicker skins. The varieties used in Maine are Marafax, soldier, and yellow-eye, with yellow-eye being the most popular variety.

Both varieties are often made with salt pork or bacon. However, there is also a long tradition of vegetarian baked beans made with the same recipe as Boston baked beans or Maine baked beans but made without the addition of salt pork or bacon.

## The History Minute "The Restraining Acts"

#### Presented by Randall Bush, Secretary

Compatriot Bush discusses two Acts passed by the Parliament of Great Britain which comprised the Restraining Acts of 1775. These limited colonial trade in response to both increasing and spreading civil disobedience in Massachusetts and New England, and similar trade restrictions instituted by elected colonial representatives.

These two Acts taken together limited trade only with Great Britain and affected New England and, shortly later the remainder of the colonies. Instead of quieting the populace, these coercive laws had been met with increasing resistance and rising resentment among the colonials.

## The Featured Speaker Presentation "Exploits of my Ancestor in the War for Independence"

#### Introduced by Melvin Richards, VP of Programs Presented by Richard Brock

Compatriot Brock discusses the experiences of his Patriot Ancestor, Captain John Johnson, during the Revolution running British blockades in New York while smuggling gunpowder to the rebels. He tells several anecdotes about Captain Johnson: In one, using a hatchet, he hacks off the hand of King George's statue in New York City. Flinging it away, he proclaims "this hand will never sign another bill of taxation for we Americans!"

He and his wife sold all of their New York properties and removed to Charleston SC, where they lived for the remainder of their days. Richard made a trip to the church in Charleston where they saw the graves of Captain Johnson and his wife and the epitaphs on their stones.
