
July Activities

The Texas SAR 250 Monument

Texas SAR Compatriots,

I want to update you on the status of the Texas SAR 250 Monument that will honor those Patriots who died or are buried in Texas!

The monument design is fully completed and construction will begin this August. We expect delivery and installation of the monument this September. The exact position for the monument has now been set by Texas SAR and the Texas State Cemetery.

A Dedication Ceremony is being planned for the weekend of April 17, 2026 in coordination with the Texas SAR State Convention in Austin.

We are now raising funds for the program, which will include:

- o Official Unveiling and Dedication
- o Participation of the Texas SAR Color Guard
- o Attendance by dignitaries, including elected officials and both State and National SAR officers
- o Recognition of substantial donors
- o Recognition of descendants being honored on the monument
- o Music from local choir

The Dedication Ceremony will take place the morning of April 18th at the Texas State Cemetery in advance of the Youth Awards Luncheon, and we hope that we will have a large turnout for both!

We are in need of some additional funding for the Dedication Ceremony and appreciate the generosity of our chapters and compatriots. I want to thank those chapters and compatriots who have already contributed to this effort!

The 2025 Activities Celebrating President James Monroe's 267th Birthday

**Westmoreland County Ceremony
The Birthplace and Visitor's Center
4460 James Monroe Highway Colonial Beach VA 22443
5 October 2025 2:00pm**

Starting at **2:00 p.m. at the Birthplace**, the 267th anniversary ceremonies are expected to include local and state elected officials. Come to see both the **Birthplace House** and the exhibits at the **Visitor Center**. The ceremony will be in front of the Birthplace House again, rather than in front of the Visitor Center. See www.monroefoundation.org for the Birthplace location at 4460 James Monroe Highway (State Rt. 205) just outside of Colonial Beach.

Please remember that President Monroe was the only President besides George Washington to have actively served in the regular army during the Revolutionary War, participating in six major battles (as well as wintering at Valley Forge, crossing the Delaware with George Washington, being seriously wounded at Trenton and cited for conspicuous bravery) and subsequently served simultaneously as Secretary of War and Secretary of State (during the War of 1812, when he helped coordinate American defenses against the British). He was also an active participant in our first American lineage society, the Society of the Cincinnati.

When James Monroe and other patriots seized the Virginia Governor's Palace on June 24, 1775, and distributed its armory of muskets, pistols, and swords to the Williamsburg militia, that act began the Revolutionary War in Virginia. Let's celebrate that 250th anniversary by honoring James Monroe in proper fashion!

We hope that you will be able to participate with us in this commemorations to emphasize the role of this great Virginian and Founding Father in establishing our country, and its system of government and values.

It is with deep sadness that we report the passing of our friend and Compatriot Bill Watts on June 5, 2025. Bill passed peacefully at his home in Rockwall. As a man of strong faith, he had told many that he was ready to go home and be with his beloved Laura. A more devoted and active member of the SAR one could not find. His passing leaves a hole in our hearts and in the SAR.

Bill was born on June 14, 1949, in Columbia, South Carolina, to William and Letha Watts, and was the eldest of five children. His early years were full of adventure, mischief, and learning, especially during cherished summers spent on his grandparents' farm in Pageland, South Carolina. Those childhood days - filled with laughter, livestock, and the closeness of family - were some of his fondest memories. Bill and his siblings shared a special bond that remained strong throughout his life. Alongside brothers Chuck and Donny, sister Cindy, and younger brother Marty, Bill's upbringing was rich in both love and character-building experiences as the family moved across South Carolina, North Carolina, and Georgia.

A celebration of Bill's remarkable life is scheduled for Saturday, 26 July at 2:00pm at the Rest Haven Funeral Home, 2500 State Highway 66 East, Rockwall TX. 75087.

Regarding his Patriot Ancestor
Charles Christopher Hutchings**

**Charles Christopher Hutchings (Hutchins)
Born 1752 Death 1825**

Captain Hutchings was a Revolutionary War Soldier in the Continental Army. Captain Charles Hutchings also served with Pittsylvania County Militia, Virginia Militia during the American Revolution.

He was the son of Christopher Charles and Elizabeth Parks Hutchings, of Dry Fork, Virginia and served as a Revolutionary war soldier and Indian scout. He was present at the surrender of the British at Yorktown, VA.

He married the daughter of his former Commander, Captain Thomas Dillard, Jr, Elizabeth Dillard, in 1784 in Pittsylvania County, Virginia. They had one child during their marriage.

Captain Charles Christopher Hutchings was born in 1752 in Rixeyville, Virginia. He died in 1825 in White County, Tennessee, at the age of 71, and was buried there.

JOHN PAUL JONES, FATHER OF THE U S NAVY

John Paul Jones was born John Paul in July, 1792 in Scotland, the son of a gardener. This month, July 2025 will be his 233rd birthday. John Paul Jones was a true American Hero, a powerful force in our battle for independence.

Among his accomplishments:

- 1st American to raise an American flag on a U S Warship, the USS Arnold.
- 1st American to capture a British warship. He captured 46 British ships during the revolutionary war.
- 1st person to attack Great Britain on their own turf in over 100 years.
- Commander of the first U S warship with U S Marines aboard who made their first amphibious landing from his ship.

He was the son of a gardener. His father was head gardener of a huge upper class estate and John Paul grew up around culture and wealth, although he had none of that. He grew up realizing his ambition could best be accomplished by becoming a British naval war ship commander. At 17, he joined the British Merchant Marines, rose through the ranks and commanded a Merchant Marine vessel. He then enlisted in the British navy and again rose through the ranks. After killing a mutinous sailor, he fled to Virginia to avoid prosecution, adding Jones to his name.



After his illustrious career during the Revolutionary War, he retired to Paris after the American congress temporarily saw no need for a navy and disbanded his command.

He died of illness in 1792, was buried in Paris and forgotten for over 100 years.

Interest in him rose again at the 100th anniversary of the country and his body was exhumed and returned to America accompanied by six naval vessels. The captain's remains were finally re-interred in a bronze and marble sarcophagus, designed by Sylvain Salières, at the U S Naval Academy.

Victory at Sea 1776 – 1789

French and British battle in the Indian Ocean

The worldwide implications of the American War for Independence are made clear on this day in history as the American-allied French navy begins a 14-month-long series of five battles with the British navy in the Indian Ocean. Between February 17, 1782, and September 3, 1782, French Admiral Pierre Andre de Suffren de Saint-Tropez, otherwise known as Bailli de Suffren, and British Vice-Admiral Sir Edward Hughes, commander in chief in the East Indies, engaged in four major battles in the Indian Ocean region: the Battle of Sadras on February 17, the Battle of Providien on April 12, the Battle of Negapatam on July 6 and the Battle of Trincomalee on September 3. The French attacked British possessions on the Indian coast and in Ceylon as part of the world war spawned by the American Revolution. Although Suffren failed to take any of Hughes' ships, he managed to prevent Hughes from taking any of his own fleet. This alone was a significant improvement in French performance when pitted against the legendary British navy. The fifth and final encounter of the two fleets—the Battle of Cuddalore on April 20, 1783—forced Hughes to leave for Madras, just before Suffren learned of the Treaty of Paris and returned to France.

En route home at the Cape of Good Hope, Suffren received compliments on his strategy from the English captains he had opposed in East India. Napoleon, too, had a high opinion of Suffren, commenting that he would have become France's Lord Nelson, had he survived. Instead, he died suddenly in France on December 8, 1788, of either a stroke or wounds from a duel.

Hughes also profited from the East India campaign. He returned to Britain extremely wealthy from the various prizes and exquisites he won in the Indies and had his portrait painted in full naval splendor by the renowned Sir Joshua Reynolds.




