

President's Message

The Declaration of Independence Its Significance For Us All

The countdown to next year's 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence begins this month.

It might seem odd that our focus isn't on the first shots fired at Lexington and Concord (April 19, 1775), or the British surrender at Yorktown (Oct. 19, 1781) or the signing of the peace treaty (Sept. 3, 1783).

Instead, our attention should be on the Declaration's approval on July 4, 1776. The reason? It was the seminal event in the creation of the United States, and world-changing, too.

The following comments are excerpts from Karl Rove's column in the Wall Street Journal July 3, 2025:

The “self-evident” truths that “all men are created equal” and “endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights”—alongside the explanation that “to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed”. There had never been anything like it.

Abraham Lincoln understood the magnitude of what had happened. What held the nation together through the American Revolution and after “was not the mere matter of the separation of the colonies from the mother land,” he said. It was “that sentiment in the Declaration . . . which gave liberty, not only to the people of this country, but, I hope, to the world, for all future time.”

Yet many Americans have seemingly lost sight of the treasure those 56 delegates who met in Philadelphia left us.

We'd be better off as a country if, individually as well as in our families, neighborhoods and communities, we use the next year to read, think and talk about the American Revolution. That would help us realize how significant the U.S. founding was to world history and our responsibility in the timeless struggle to live up to the Declaration's ideals.

We'll have help. On Nov. 16, Ken Burns, Sarah Botstein and David Schmidt will premiere a six-part, 12-hour PBS documentary, "The American Revolution." Written by Geoffrey Ward, it took eight years to make.

To celebrate the 250th anniversary is fine. To live up to the Declaration's promise, however, we must honor its critical role in history by better understanding whence America came and why. No better place to start than the beginning; no better time than now. Relearn our founding principles. You have your assignments. July 2026 isn't far off.

The Texas SAR 250 Monument

I want to update you on the status of the Texas SAR 250 Monument that will honor those Patriots who died or are buried in Texas!

The monument design is fully completed and construction will begin this August. We expect delivery and installation of the monument this September. The exact position for the monument has now been set by Texas SAR and the Texas State Cemetery.

A Dedication Ceremony is being planned for the weekend of April 17, 2026 in coordination with the Texas SAR State Convention in Austin.

We are now raising funds for the program, which will include:

- o Official Unveiling and Dedication
- o Participation of the Texas SAR Color Guard
- o Attendance by dignitaries, including elected officials and both State and National SAR officers
- o Recognition of substantial donors
- o Recognition of descendants being honored on the monument
- o Music from local choir

The Dedication Ceremony will take place the morning of April 18th at the Texas State Cemetery in advance of the Youth Awards Luncheon, and we hope that we will have a large turnout for both!

This symposium about Spain's contributions to the American Revolution will be held Friday, September 19 in the afternoon and all day on Saturday, September 20, 2025, in DAR Constitution Hall. All events including academic lectures, panel discussions, and other activities will be free and open to the public with pre-registration required. The 2025 Activities Celebrating President James Monroe's 267th Birthday

**Westmoreland County Ceremony
The Birthplace and Visitor's Center
4460 James Monroe Highway Colonial Beach VA 22443
5 October 2025 2:00pm**

Starting at **2:00 p.m. at the Birthplace**, the 267th anniversary ceremonies are expected to include local and state elected officials. Come to see both the **Birthplace House** and the exhibits at the **Visitor Center**. The ceremony will be in front of the Birthplace House again, rather than in front of the Visitor Center. See www.monroefoundation.org for the Birthplace location at 4460 James Monroe Highway (State Rt. 205) just outside of Colonial Beach.

Please remember that President Monroe was the only President besides George Washington to have actively served in the regular army during the Revolutionary War, participating in six major battles (as well as wintering at Valley Forge, crossing the Delaware with George Washington, being seriously wounded at Trenton and cited for conspicuous bravery) and subsequently served simultaneously as Secretary of War and Secretary of State (during the War of 1812, when he helped coordinate American defenses against the British). He was also an active participant in our first American lineage society, the Society of the Cincinnati.

When James Monroe and other patriots seized the Virginia Governor's Palace on June 24, 1775, and distributed its armory of muskets, pistols, and swords to the Williamsburg militia, that act began the Revolutionary War in Virginia. Let's celebrate that 250th anniversary by honoring James Monroe in proper fashion!

We hope that you will be able to participate with us in this commemorations to emphasize the role of this great Virginian and Founding Father in establishing our country, and its system of government and values.

Regarding his Patriot Ancestor
Richard Inman**

From the book “The Story of the Wyoming Valley” regarding the Battle of Wyoming - July 3, 1778, Luzerne county, Pennsylvania.

The incident known as “Inman's Nap” has two or more versions. The most popular one is the following: "Richard Inman started with the Hanover company up the valley the day of the battle. At every house they stopped they imbibed liquid refreshments. Inman filled a bottle so that he could have something between visits. The old man could not carry his load, so he lay down. The battle was fought and lost and men were getting out of harm's way. Lazarus Butler was urging his horse along when he came upon Rufus Bennet, who was pursued by an Indian. Bennet caught on to the tail of the Colonel's horse, and away they went. The fleet footed savage had nearly overtaken them when Bennet saw Inman sitting up, rubbing his eyes. 'Shoot that Indian!' Bennet cried. The old hunter swung his rifle to his shoulder without getting up and dropped the Indian as quick as he had often shot a deer on the run.

Four of Richard Inman's brothers were in the battle; two were killed. One swam the river in his flight, and being overheated, died. Two much whiskey probably saved the life of Richard, as well as that of Rufus Bennet. Another brother, the next winter, thought he heard the call of a wild turkey. He took his gun and went after it. The next spring his body was found scalped by the Indians that had deceived him. The Inmans became known as Indian killers and squared up with them with interest. One of the Inmans had notches in the stock of his rifle to tally the number he killed.

The Less Known Midnight Ride

On the night of June 3, 1781, 26-year-old Jack Jouett was sleeping at his father's tavern in Louisa County, Virginia, when he was awakened by the sound of Banastre Tarleton's British cavalry passing by on the road toward Charlottesville, where the Virginia legislature and Governor Thomas Jefferson had fled after Richmond fell to the British. Suspecting that Tarleton was intent on capturing them, and knowing that the road was undefended, Jouett set out on the 40-mile midnight ride that would make him famous.

Traveling by moonlight and forced to take little-used trails through the woods, Jouett rode all night, racing to Charlottesville and arriving ahead of the hard-riding British cavalry. When he reached Monticello at 4:30 a.m., Jefferson was already working in his garden. Jouett warned the governor and his guests (who included some of the legislators) that the British were coming, then sped off to town to alert the others, including Patrick Henry, Benjamin Harrison, and Richard Henry Lee.

Thanks to Jack Jouett, Thomas Jefferson and nearly all of the members of the Virginia General Assembly made it safely out of Charlottesville before Tarleton's cavalry arrived. Without his warning, it is likely the entire Virginia government would have been captured or killed.

Thanks to Longfellow, nearly everyone remembers Paul Revere. By comparison, Jack Jouett is little known outside of Virginia. June 7th is Jack Jouett Day in Virginia, in honor of his heroic ride of June 3-4, 1781.


