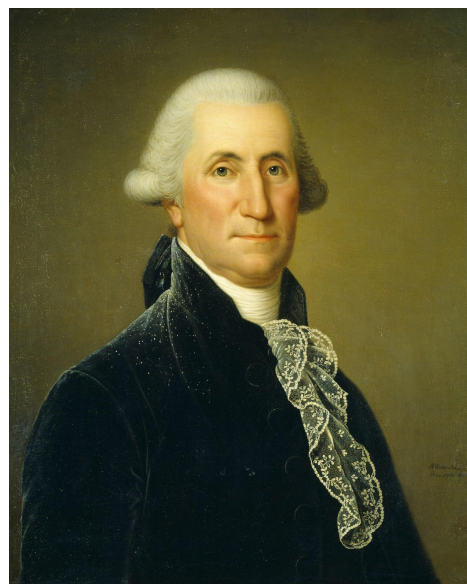

The Texas SAR 250 Monument

Texas SAR Compatriots,

I want to update you on the status of the Texas SAR 250 Monument that will honor those Patriots who died or are buried in Texas!

The monument design is fully completed and construction will begin this August. We expect delivery and installation of the monument this September. The exact position for the monument has now been set by Texas SAR and the Texas State Cemetery.

A Dedication Ceremony is being planned for the weekend of April 17, 2026 in coordination with the Texas SAR State Convention in Austin.

We are now raising funds for the program, which will include:

- o Official Unveiling and Dedication
- o Participation of the Texas SAR Color Guard
- o Attendance by dignitaries, including elected officials and both State and National SAR officers
- o Recognition of substantial donors
- o Recognition of descendants being honored on the monument
- o Music from local choir

The Dedication Ceremony will take place the morning of April 18th at the Texas State Cemetery in advance of the Youth Awards Luncheon, and we hope that we will have a large turnout for both!

We are in need of some additional funding for the Dedication Ceremony and appreciate the generosity of our chapters and compatriots. I want to thank those chapters and compatriots who have already contributed to this effort!

The 2025 Activities Celebrating President James Monroe's 267th Birthday

Westmoreland County Ceremony
The Birthplace and Visitor's Center
4460 James Monroe Highway Colonial Beach VA 22443
5 October 2025 2:00pm

Starting at **2:00 p.m. at the Birthplace**, the 267th anniversary ceremonies are expected to include local and state elected officials. Come to see both the **Birthplace House** and the exhibits at the **Visitor Center**. The ceremony will be in front of the Birthplace House again, rather than in front of the Visitor Center. See www.monroefoundation.org for the Birthplace location at 4460 James Monroe Highway (State Rt. 205) just outside of Colonial Beach.

Please remember that President Monroe was the only President besides George Washington to have actively served in the regular army during the Revolutionary War, participating in six major battles (as well as wintering at Valley Forge, crossing the Delaware with George Washington, being seriously wounded at Trenton and cited for conspicuous bravery) and subsequently served simultaneously as Secretary of War and Secretary of State (during the War of 1812, when he helped coordinate American defenses against the British). He was also an active participant in our first American lineage society, the Society of the Cincinnati.

When James Monroe and other patriots seized the Virginia Governor's Palace on June 24, 1775, and distributed its armory of muskets, pistols, and swords to the Williamsburg militia, that act began the Revolutionary War in Virginia. Let's celebrate that 250th anniversary by honoring James Monroe in proper fashion!

We hope that you will be able to participate with us in this commemorations to emphasize the role of this great Virginian and Founding Father in establishing our country, and its system of government and values.

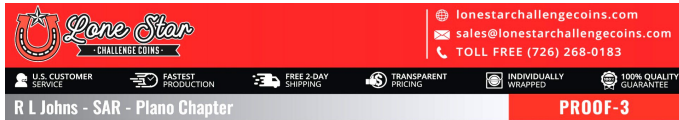

Regarding his Patriot Ancestor
Jacob Van Fossen**

Jacob Van Fossen was born September 8, 1756 in Worcester Township, Philadelphia County (which later became Montgomery County).

In July 1776, Jacob joined a volunteer company in his neighborhood near Philadelphia. They trained weekly but remained at home to be ready to defend their homes at a “minutes notice “....like a minute man.

In the fall of 1776, Jacob’s Associator Group gathered at Wentz’s Tavern near Germantown and marched to Philadelphia . They joined General George Washington’s Continental Army. After two weeks of training they began their march toward New York, where the British had landed 15,000 to 20,000 troops. They went across Trenton , Princeton, and New Brunswick to Perth Amboy.

They held Berth Amboy, digging entrenchments for several weeks to prevent the British from attacking northern New Jersey from Staten Island and Long Island. After two months, they returned to Pennsylvania.

In September 8th, 1777, Jacob’s Group was called out again and marched to Brandywine, PA and joined General Washington and the Continental Army again. He was promoted to Ensign. When the Continental Army withdrew from Brandywine, Jacob’s Pennsylvania Militia (that was in charge of Washington’s left flank) gathered the Army’s supplies they had been guarding and moved them the west Bank of the Schuylkill River, northwest of Philadelphia. They were engaged at the Paoli Massacre and the battle of Whitemarch. In October, the Continental Army and Pennsylvania Militia attacked the British at Germantown. After Germantown, the Militia went home for the winter and the Continental Army withdrew to Valley Forge.

In June of 1778, Jacob’s Associators were again called out and marched to Monmouth Courthouse, New Jersey and again joined the Washington’s Continental Army and engaged the British there.

After Monmouth, the Militia returned to Pennsylvania. Jacob became a Tax Collector and recruited for the Army. In 1881, Jacob and his brother John and their families moved to Augusta County, VA, where in 1845 he died of natural causes and is buried. During his life he has 3 wives and 6 children, 4 born in Pennsylvania and 2 born in Virginia.

The United States Marine Corps Hymn

The "Marines' Hymn", the official hymn of the United States Marine Corps, was introduced by the first director of the USMC Band, Francesco Maria Scala. Its music originates from an 1867 work by Jacques Offenbach with the lyrics added by an anonymous author at an unknown time in the following years. Authorized by the Commandant of the Marine Corps in 1929, it is the oldest official song in the United States Armed Forces. The "Marines' Hymn" is typically sung at the position of attention as a gesture of respect, akin to a national anthem. However, the third verse is also used as a toast during formal events, such as the birthday ball and other ceremonies.

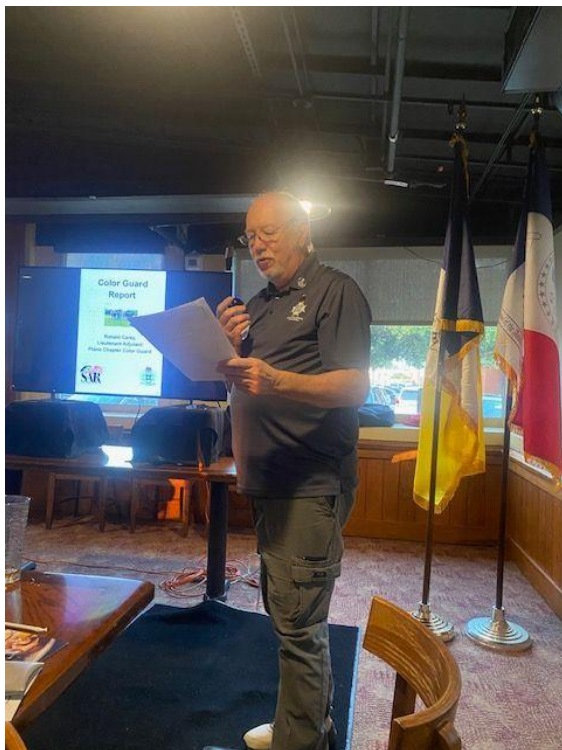
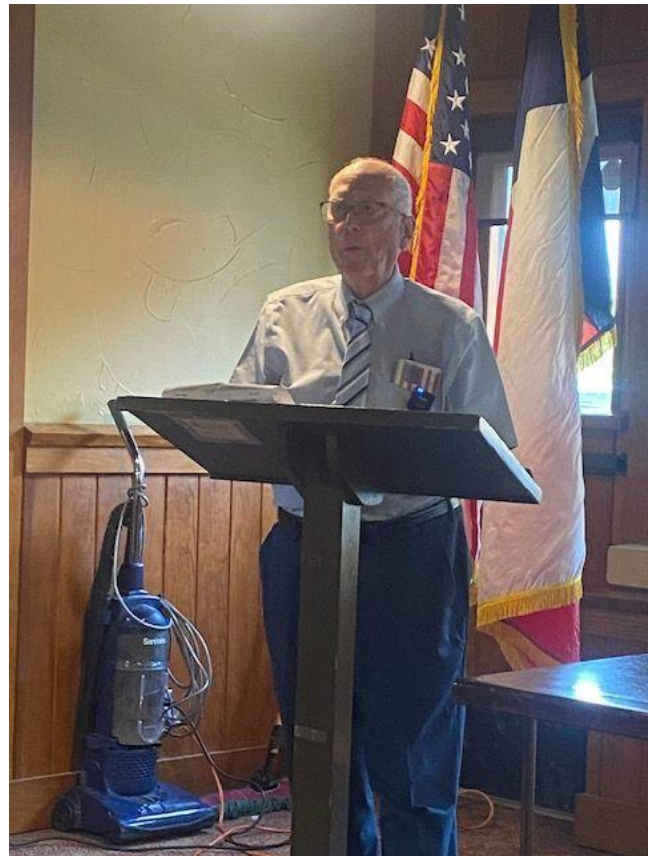
