Lieutenant Bobby Ferguson began his career in law enforcement as a Houston Police Explorer at the age of 16. He then began working for the Harris County Sheriff's Office in December of 2003 as a jail deputy. While working at the Harris County Sheriff's Office, he attended the University of Houston-Downtown Police Academy and graduated in 2005 with commendations in academic and physical fitness.

He began his career with Harris County Constable's Office, Precinct 5 as a Deputy on June 6th, 2006, and was assigned to the Patrol Division. His responsibilities were to protect life and property, preserve the peace and maintain order, suppress crime, investigate reports of crimes, enforce all state and federal laws, conduct investigations, and to make arrests as required.

On April 25th, 2011, he joined the Jersey Village Police Department, again, as a patrolman. During his 9-year career there, he climbed through the ranks from Patrolman, Corporal, Sergeant, and then to Patrol Lieutenant. In February of 2020, he decided to return to Harris County Constable's Office, Precinct 5 and start over at the rank of deputy. Within a year, he was promoted to the rank of Sergeant in the Patrol Division and later transferred to the Parks Division. He was also responsible for investigations of incidents, complaints, and other situations that needed to be addressed. In October of 2024, he was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant.

Lt. Ferguson is a Master Peace Officer, a certified TCOLE Instructor, a Special Investigator, a Field Training Deputy, firearms instructor, and a graduate of FBI-LEEDA. He also has experience as a Field Training Supervisor and a STEP Grant Manager.

He has received several letters of commendation for his actions in the line of duty. With over 21 years of service, he considers his service to the department and community an honor and a privilege.
