Americanism Contests and Awards

For the first time in Chapter History, Robert Rankin sponsored each of the seven youth programs. A chapter has sponsored a program when a reasonable effort has been made to initiate that program, whether or not successful. (Reasonable effort does not include mail contact.) These programs include the Looney Poster Contest, Knight Essay Contest, CAR Essay Contest, Eagle Scout Contest, American History Teacher Contest, Extended JROTC Contest and the Oratory Contest. The Chapter sent entries in five of the seven contests to state; once again a chapter high water mark.

Mayde Creek High School teacher Penny Rosas finished as the runner-up in the Tom & Betty Lawrence American History Teacher Award and Greg Thorne made a strong showing in the Eagle Scout Contest. David Jones and John Davis are Committee Chairman for these two programs, respectively.

2008 marked the sixth straight year that the Rankin Chapter has had a state entry in both the Poster and Knight Essay Contests and the third year that we had a state award winner. This was our third year in a row to have CAR essay contestants and the third year that we have had state finalists. In addition this was the third straight year that we have had an Eagle Scout nominee while Ms. Rosas was our first History Teacher nominated to State. In 2006 we had our only extended JROTC contestant and we are still searching for our first Oratory entry.

★ More Rankin Chapter Awards ★

The Rankin Chapter was one of only three chapters in the State to receive the coveted Texas SAR John Harrell CAR Award for excellence in participation with CAR Societies. To earn the award each chapter must report activity in seven of nine areas. The Rankin Chapter reported activity in all nine areas. In the photo below CAR Liaison Chairman Tom Jackson, on the left, receives the streamer and a \$50 cash award from State CAR Committee Chairman and State VP Steve Rohrbough.



For the third consecutive year the Rankin Chapter qualified for the Texas Furlong Award for the issuance of at least one flag certificate. Also for the third year in a row the Rankin Chapter unofficially awarded the most flag certificates in the State Society with 43!
