

For the second consecutive year, Robert Rankin sponsored each of the seven Americanism contest programs. A chapter has sponsored a program when a reasonable effort has been made to initiate that program, whether or not successful. (Reasonable effort does not include mail These programs contact.) (with Committee Chaiman noted in parenthesis) include the Looney Poster Contest (Ed Raines), Knight Essay Contest (David Jones), CAR Essay Contest (Tom Jackson), Eagle Scout Contest (Ash Jackson), American History Teacher Contest (David Jones), Extended JROTC Contest (Patrick Kerr) and the Oratory Contest (Tom Jackson). The Chapter sent entries to state in five of the seven contests for the second year in a row.

#### TXSSAR Outstanding Chapter Award: The TXSSAR Americanism Awards:

The Rankin Chpter received the Outstanding Small Chapter Award for the fifth consecutive year and was awarded the Americanism Award for the third consecutive year. Steve Tanner is shown below accepting both awards on behalf of the chapter. The Chapter not only earned the most points in its size category, but also the most points in the state in all size categories.

The Chapter received the The John K. Harrell CAR Activities Award, named for Compatriot Harrell of the San Antonio Chapter, and intended to recognize those chapters who support strong relationships between the SAR and the Children of the American Revolution.

The Chapter also won the John K. Harrell CAR Competition Award and received a monetary award of \$50. The Rankin Chapter had the most points of any chapter in the state for these activities as well.

The Chapter received the Flag furlong award and for the fourth year in a row led the state in the issuance of flag certificates!

For the fourth year in a row, the Historian for Robert Rankin has been honored as having submitted the Outstanding Yearbook in its size category for Texas. Steve Tanner submitted a remarkable yearbook and received accolades for creativity and organization. The chapter yearbook takes between 100 and 200 hours to compile.

#### Individual Compatriot Awards

As you might expect in a chapter such as ours, the State decided to recognize individuals for their contributions of time and talent. The first to be so recognized was Patrick Kerr, shown in the photo at the top of the next column, for his service to Veterans.

The next Rankin Compatriot to be individually recognized was David Jones, wearing his trademark green vest and appearing on the right in the photo below, who has just received the Alexander Hamilton Medal and Certificate. Previously in the evening, he received the State Bronze Chapter Service Medal for his service as State Subcommittee Chaiman of the American History Teacher Contest.



The third Rankin Compatriot to be singled out was Edwin Raines who was awarded the Patriot Medal!

The Patriot Medal is awarded only by a state society. It is the highest award given for service at the state or chapter level. This medal is presented only to individuals and may be received only once.

The Patriot Medal represents long, faithful and outstanding service and must ignore service at the national level.

Ed is perhaps the first Compatriot in Texas to receive the Patriot's Medal solely for service at the Chapter level. At the Rankin Chapter where he was a founding member, he served two terms as President, two terms as Historian, five terms as Registrar and two as Sergeant at Arms. He has twice been awarded the Liberty Medal, for being the first line sponsor for new members.

He started the Chapter's Knight Essay Contest program and served 6 years as its chairman, with entries garnering a 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> at the state level. He chaired the Looney Poster Contest, which he started, for eight years and from his 1,708 entries three earned a 3<sup>rd</sup> place finish at state. Each contestant received a certificate of appreciation, prepared and often personally presented by Ed, for participation. In his six years as Chairman of the Flag Show he has gone to 122 locations where he presented 669 programs to an estimated 17,081 people.

For good measure he worked with Tom Jackson to receive the Partners in Patriotism

Award – 2008 for working with the VFW in recognition of Sea Cadets.
