SPOTLIGHT ON SAN ANTONIO CHAPTER COMPATRIOTS

This compatriot has just finished his autobiography. It is being printed by a printing company in Austin. The book deals with his life since he was four years old, and details the story of a young Mexican American who was in the military service of our country through three wars, and who began his elementary schooling in Laredo without knowing one word of English. During his career, he earned a degree in Veterinary Medicine, plus a Master of Science in Veterinary Medicine and Surgery at Texas A & M University; and a Ph.D. in Pathology from Michigan State University. He was a Private in the Marine Corps during the battle for Iwo Jima, and retired from the U.S. Army as a Colonel. Following Army retirement, he accepted the Directorship of The Institute of Tropical Veterinary Medicine and retired as a Professor of Veterinary Pathology from A & M after 29 creditable years. The book will be available o/a November 15. Among many other topics, he discusses is being a descendant of James White, founder of Knoxville, TN, and his acceptance in our San Antonio Chapter in September, 2001. WEBSITE

The SARSAT.org Website has been completely re-done. The original seven pages have been replaced by thirteen new pages. Although seven is supposed to be a "lucky" number, the seven pages didn't work very well. And, while thirteen is supposed to be an "unlucky" number, the thirteen new pages are working much better. Actually, if we think in terms of the original Thirteen Colonies, thirteen is a pretty lucky number. One of the major changes is the addition of a special page that was created exclusively for information about the 2007 State Meeting of TXSSAR in San Antonio. Be sure to check this page often for revised and additional information that will be forthcoming from George Harcourt, Committee Chairman for the State Meeting.

One big improvement of the website permits users to view the pages with either a PC type (MS Windows), or Macintosh computer using their various operating systems, and accessed by several different Browsers. The website was developed using Microsoft FrontPage software, and the new pages still display better with a PC and MS Internet Explorer. We will leave that information posted on each page until such time as that circumstance can be completely corrected.

Each of the new pages will be reviewed and discussed in future issues of the Newsletter.
