APRIL SPEAKER - NANCY BRENNAN

Nancy Brennan was our guest speaker at the April 15th meeting. Ms. Brennan was introduced by Rueben Perez. She is a certified genealogist associated the San Antonio Genealogical and Historical Society and a prominent DAR having held many offices including Regent. Ms Brennan provided information regarding genealogical research using printed materials and the internet. Ms. Brennan cautioned us to be sure to use documents that



are well researched and which agree with each other. She provided seven hints for those working with genealogical records. Members found this very helpful, and asked that the hints be repeated here.

- 1. Use original documents wherever possible. Many of these documents are not available on film, and some are even available online via the internet.
- 2. **Use good, well documented books.** Remember that even using the best resources, mistakes can be perpetuated.
- 3. **Newspapers now go back to the early 1700's.** The SA Genealogical Library has access to the New England continued on page 3

to make a donation to the scholarship fund, he quickly brought the conversation to a close.

I would have liked to have told him about our participation in the Tejeda Middle School History Fair and other Chapter activities. Like most organizations, the 20/80 rule prevails in SAR, meaning that 80% of the work is done by 20% of the members. All of our events last year were carried out by 12% of the San Antonio Chapter's membership.

Our color guard consists of only 8 members who pay their own way to these events, which are sometimes many miles away. Your Executive Committee at the April meeting reluctantly voted to cancel the July 4th "Let Freedom Ring Event" at the Alamo as there were three events scheduled within a six-hour period. The Alamo event was the one that would take the most of our time and financial resources, as well as risk the health of our volunteers on a hot July afternoon. If more active members participated, we could do much more to promote patriotism and support our youth and servicemen.

As Patriot Thomas Paine wrote so many years ago: "These are the times that try men's souls. The summer soldier and sunshine patriot will, in the crisis, shrink from the service of their country; but he that stands it now, deserves the love and thanks of man and woman."

Historical Society and the New England Genealogical Society. It is worth a visit just for those memberships. (Membership is \$36 yearly)

- 4. **Examine naming patterns.** Many ethnic groups use distinctive naming patterns and these patterns can be ancestral clues.
- 5. **Do timelines.** You can 'google' the word 'timeline' and see numerous free examples of timeline programs. Timelines are extremely valuable when determining and comparing the birth-baptism-marriage-family-work-ownership lines of ancestry. All gaps should be noted and researched.
- 6. **Use the internet.** It is almost impossible in today's world not to make use of this extraordinary tool. Some excellent research sites include: (All begin with www.)


