Dear San Antonio Chapter Compatriots and friends:

As you know President General of the National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution Butler is a member of the San Antonio chapter. While his schedule and work load will be heavy over the next 12 months you will see him from time to time at our chapter meetings. The officers of your chapter invite you to join in with the program that President General Butler describes in his brief message below.

Dear Compatriots:

I wish to express my appreciation for being elected unanimously as your 106th President General at the 119th Congress in Atlanta. As Secretary General I led the Strategic Planning Committee in developing a comprehensive Long Range Plan. The 22 page document was approved by the new Executive Committee at its first meeting on July 9th in Atlanta. It will be posted on the SAR web site as soon as possible. It will be my pleasure to lead our organization this year.

My first objective is to negotiate a construction contract for our SAR Library on West Main Street in Louisville. Under the leadership of PG Wilcox we are well on our way. I have appointed PG Larry D. McClanahan to lead the Design Review and Construction Committee. Larry is a licensed engineer with decades of experience in dealing with architects and contractors. PG McClanahan plans to meet with the architect and contractor next week. As I said in my acceptance speech on July 8th, I firmly believe that that we have the talented manpower to "walk and chew gum at the same time". The approved Long Range Plan is the blue print which will guide us for many years in the future. From that plan I intend to concentrate on three areas:

MODERNIZE PUBLICIZE SOCIALIZE

Ian Toler of the Maryland Society is well on his way toward a new and innovative SAR web site. Members will be able to register for the SAR Congress and Leadership Meetings online using Pay Pal or a credit card. Online purchases will be available using either method. The new web site promises to be faster, with much greater storage capacity. For the first time, there will be a members only section, which can be accessed by your SAR membership number plus a secret code to be provided by the staff. In the members only section there will be several forums, where members can discuss genealogy, history, membership, etc. SAR financial statesheets and the budget will ments. balance be available.

DVD's were passed out at Congress with a message from me directed toward prospective new members. The disc contained footage of our color guard at several functions and showed our members at work at Leadership meetings. Hopefully, this will be a great recruiting tool. We are already working on a new DVD which I plan to send to each chapter president with a request that it be shown at a chapter meeting. This is designed to show chapter members how other chapter are engaged in SAR activities, with the hope that it will stimulate them to partici pate in programs for the first time.

Spanish Adventure

The National Society SAR is planning a trip to Spain in May 2010 to honor the contribution that Spain made during the Revolutionary War. Our travel agent is obtaining group rates for air from Washington, DC on May 10. We will fly into Madrid on May 11, and stay at the InterContinental Hotel. While in Madrid, we will tour Spain's capital – the Royal Palace, the Armory, the Plaza Mayor and the Old Quarter – and visit the US Embassy. We will travel to *El Escorial*, the palace from which King Philip II ruled the Spanish Empire, and view the tombs of Spanish Monarchs interred there, including King Carlos III, who assisted the Americans in their revolution against England. Plans are being made for an audience with the Royal Family. From Madrid, we will day-trip to Toledo, a former capital of Visigothic Hispania and the Spanish Empire. In Toledo we will see its famous Cathedral and the Jewish Quarter.

On May 16, we will take the train to Granada, the last of the Moorish kingdoms to be re-conquered by the Spanish; while there we will tour the *Alhambra*, before continuing on to Málaga, on the Costa del Sol. On May 17, we will day trip to Macharaviaya, the home town of Spanish General Bernardo de Gálvez, and visit the monument to Gálvez. On May 18, we will have a reception with the Málaga Town Council, and then tour the town. On May 19, we will visit the shipyard where a replica of the brig Galveztown is being built. We will continue on to Ronda, the birthplace of modern bullfighting three hundred years ago. In a letter to George Washington dated August 1st, 1775, Elbridge Gerry, struggling at the Siege of Boston, begged for gunpowder. To George Washington's "very great astonishment" he said he was down to only 36 barrels. Washington could have sworn that Gerry had 308 barrels.

Washington had asked the Committee of Supplies how much gunpowder they had. The Committee of Supplies, "not being sufficiently acquainted with the nature of a return (message) sent in an account of all the ammunition which had been collected, so that the report included not only gunpowder on hand, but what had been spent."

Washington banged his head against the wall . . . so to speak.

Gerry survived and went on to be James Madison's Vice President.

August 2nd: Thomas Jefferson drafted the Declaration of Independence between June 11th and June 28th, 1776. On July 4th, the Continental Congress adopted the Declaration. Delegates began signing it on August 2nd.

August 3rd: The Continental Congress adopted the Stars and Stripes on June 4th, 1777. On August 3rd, 1949, President Harry Truman signed an Act of Congress naming June 14th of each year as National Flag Day.

On August 7th, 1778, a British deserter had his bacon saved by a fish story. Closing questions to one of the court mar tial witnesses went like this:

"Do you recollect Colonel Morris buying a fish of the prisoner at Sandy Hook?"

"Yes sir."

"Did you hear any conversation between the Colonel and the prisoner?"

"No other than he told the Colonel that he had brought him a fish and the Colonel, asking what it had cost, paid him."

"Do you recollect hearing Colonel Morris tax him with being a deserter?"

"I believe that I have; I have often heard Colonel Morris during last summer speak very warmly against him for deserting."

After a bit more testimony, General Sir Henry Clinton gave the verdict:

"The Court having considered the Evidence for and against the Prisoner is of Opinion that he is Guilty of the crime laid to his charge, but having given himself up and been afterwards employed on different Occasions by Colonel Morris, instead of being immediately apprehended and brought to tryal, the Court is of the further opinion that this implied a Pardon and gave the Prisoner reason to regard it as such; they therefore cannot under these Circumstances proceed to Sentence or Adjudge the Prisoner any Punishment."

On August 8th, 1779, John Wentworth of New Hampshire signed the Articles of Confederation. Congress had adopted the Articles in 1777, but they were not fully ratified until 1781. They created a loose confederation of sovereign

states and a weak central government. The need for a stronger Federal government led to the Constitutional Convention in 1787. The US Constitution replaced the Articles on March 4th, 1789.

On August 10th 1780, Francis Marion, the Swamp Fox, burst forth to lead the Williamsburg Militia. He recruited Patriots and ambushed British and Loyalists until he had gained control of the supply routes to Camden.
